Question for Pastor...

"Are there different 'levels' in heaven - and hell?"



This question came during our new Sunday morning Forum study: Faith under Fire. The study takes a 'Point-Counterpoint'-style look at topics where popular culture and God's Word clash. Heaven and hell were both topics we looked at this

past month. The consensus of the popular culture is that 'everyone is going to heaven' and that 'there really is no such thing as hell.' Obviously both ideas are far from biblical.

God's Word is very clear on both subjects. Jesus did indeed take the punishment for all sin, making it possible for everyone to be forgiven and enter God's presence for eternity (i.e. heaven). But only those who admit that they need a Savior from sin and trust in Jesus as that Savior actually accept what Jesus did for them. Heaven is comparable to a gift that someone purchased for you and delivered to you. You only reap the benefits of that gift if you accept it, open it and use it. Those who never repent of their sin and trust in Jesus have, in effect, rejected the gift and left it unopened. Heaven was available to them, but they chose to reject it.

The Bible is also clear that there definitely is a place of eternal torment and suffering spent separated from the presence of God, and thus separated from anything good. We call that place 'hell.' Real people end up there - not just your massmurderer types. People who saw no need for Jesus in this life will get what they chose for eternity: Life without Jesus.

But what about the question of differing levels of bliss in heaven and differing levels of punishment in hell? Here's the answer from the lcms.org FAQ section.

In its report on The "End Times," the Synod's Commission on Theology and Church Relations says regarding hell: "In both "body and soul" unbelievers will suffer eternal separation and condemnation in hell (Matt 18:8; 25:46; Mark 9:43; John 3:36; 2 Thess. 1:9; Jude 13; Rev. 14:11).[40] Indescribable torment will be experienced consciously, the degree determined by the nature of the sins to be punished (Matt. 11:20-24; 23:15; Luke 12:47-48)."

Regarding heaven and "degrees of glory" the Commission says: "Eternal life is pictured in the Scriptures as a state of never-ending "blessedness." This means, on the one hand, that Christians will live forever in perfect freedom from sin. death, and every evil (Is. 25:8; 49:10; 1 Cor. 15:26, 55-57; Rev. 2:7, 11; 20:14; 21:4). At the same time, they will experience the unending joy of being with God in the new heavens and new earth (e.g., Revelation 21-22; Ps. 16:11). Forever eliminated is the possibility of falling away from God. This blessedness will bring with it the joy of being in eternal communion with fellow believers, whom we have reason to believe we shall recognize (cf. Matt. 17:3). And, there will be no limitations or degrees attached to the enjoyment of the happiness to be experienced, though there will be degrees of glory corresponding to differences of work and fidelity here on earth, producing praise to God but no envy (see 2 Cor. 9:6; Matt. 20:23)."

From there they will be transported to a large distribution center in the Twin Cities where they will be sorted and packaged for shipping to locations in over 100 countries.

Franklin Graham, President of Samaritan's Purse, says, "Sometimes people ask me how much difference a shoe box anc make in the life of a child who is poor, sick, hungry or traumatized by war. I tell them that the gifts are only the beginning. Church partners who hand out the boxes on our behalf also reach out to the children and their families, sharing the hope of the Gospel. By God's grace, every year hundreds of thousands of these children receive Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior through the Gospel storybooks and discipleship program."

"Let me give you an example. In 1993 in snowy Bosnia, an 11-year-old girl named Lejla received one of our very first shoe box gifts. 'That's when I knew God loved me,' she said. Raised in a non-Christian home, she didn't know who Jesus was. When one of our team shared the Gospel with her, Lejla prayed to accept Christ as her Lord and Savior. Today, living in Pennsylvania after marrying a soldier who was in Bosnia on a peacekeeping mission, Lejla Allison is packing boxes for over 50 children, and we are planning to take her back to Bosnia this winter to help hand out gifts and minister to children in her homeland."

You can help with this special ministry by packing a shoe box for a girl or boy (you choose the age). The display at church has a list of suggested items to pack. Bring the shoe box to church on or before our Dedication Sunday. Thank you for your partnership in sharing the Gospel!

The Building Committee is currently in the process of obtaining the necessary building permits from Kandiyohi County. They are also still making final determinations about the exact location of the building and parking lot on the site. Soil samples will then need to be taken from the spot the building will sit. The architect is collecting bids in order to give us a "ballpark" idea of the cost. We will be determining the amount of loan we are comfortable with - and any design changes that will need to be made due to cost factors.

Obviously there are a lot of decisions to be made. Please continue to keep your Building Committee in your prayers. Pray that we would simply follow where God is leading. We do not want to run ahead of Him, nor do we want to lag behind Him.

MEXICAN DINNER FUND RAISER

We served approximately 110 people and raised \$825 after expenses. Thrivent matched \$698, so we totaled over \$1500 for the fund raiser. Thanks to everyone who made the dinner a success!

To date we have received \$66,863 on the way to our goal of \$190,000.

I knew Dad had parked some machinery near there and didn't want to run into it and break a leg. Then I realized something was there in the shadows and I couldn't see! I waited for a moment for my eyes to adjust and just at that moment something cold and slimy touched my hand ...

A monster! Yikes! My heart pumped about a gallon of adrenalin and I jerked my hand away and ran like the wind, letting out a pitiful holler. I ran that 40 yard dash back to the house in record time, but not before our old dog Zeke got there ahead of me. You see, it was his wet

It was a new day and everything was okay.

Right now some of us are feeling something cold and slimy touch us in the dark. It's a disease we have, or it's a bad relationship, or it's the unliness of politics, or it's a shaky economy. Part of the problem is real, but part is imagined because we can't see into the shadows.

God is with us both the night and day. Now is the time to stop and realize that life is not as bad as we think it is. God, who is with us in the sunny daylight is also with us in the dark shadows of the night. Same good Lord, same Friend Jesus, same caring God with His same heart of love and mercy. He who brings us through the day will also get us through the night.

We just need to trust Him and not be afraid.

Simple Ways to Give Your Spiritual Life A Lift...

There are many situations in life that you didn't choose to be in. There are many things you wish would never have happened. (For example, no matter what election results we get this Tuesday, roughly half the country will be saying "This wasn't my choice.")

But there is a choice you ALWAYS have - even in situations you didn't choose:

You always have the choice of how you will respond. Always.

Here are two basic response choices you always have:

- 1) To give thanks for what God has given OR
- 2) To complain about what he hasn't given.

It doesn't take a rocket-scientist to figure out which choice gives you a lift and which choice brings you (and everyone around you) down.

In the Old Testament, people would set up piles of stones to help them remember what God had done for them at that place. (e.g When they would pass that place, they'd see the pile of stones and it would remind them of what God had done.)

Don't wait until Thanksgiving Day to give thanks. **Start right now**, so that by the time November 27 rolls around, you'll be into the thanksgiving habit and out of the complaining habit.

Take a moment to turn to the "My Thank You, God" List on page 16 and write down the things God has given you. Don't forget the spiritual blessings like forgiveness and eternal life. And don't complain about what God hasn't given. Instead, thank him for what he hasn't given - because if it was good for you at this time, he'd have given it

Cultivating an attitude of gratitude will give your spiritual life a lift!


