Question-for FROM Pastor...

This month I am going to interrupt our normal "Question For Pastor" schedule with a Question From Pastor:

Let's say the government made it illegal to possess a Bible and the authorities showed up to take yours. You decided to tear out just one page to keep, hide and read. Which page would you tear out? i.e "What chapter, passage or story would you want to make sure to never forget?"

In a recent sermon, I told how I would answer that question when I said, "I'd make an attempt to keep and somehow hide the whole Gospel of John, but if I could have just *one* page.... I'd keep the one that has Romans chapter 8 on it. In worship this month I am doing a sermon series on the messages in that chapter that led me to choose it.

In case you missed, here are the first two:

- There is NOTHING you can do and nothing that has been done to you - that can cause God to stop loving you. Nothing. (Romans 8:35-39)
- God has the power to make ANYTHING bad you have done and anything bad that has been done to you - work out for your ultimate good. Anything. (Romans 8:28)

During worship in August we will highlight more "I really need to remember that" kind of messages from God in Romans chapter 8, but I'm curious about what page you would tear out to keep - and why. You can email your answer to me at pastor@livingwordlutheran.net



Inspirational Story...

Bruised Apples

A few years ago a group of salesmen went to a regional sales convention in Chicago. They had assured their wives that they would be home in plenty of time for Friday night's dinner. Well, as such things go, one thing led to another. The sales meeting lasted longer than anticipated.

Their flights were scheduled to leave out of Chicago's O'Hare Airport, and they had to race to the airport. With tickets in hand, they barged through the terminal to catch their flight back home. In their rush, with tickets and briefcases, one of these salesmen inadvertently kicked over a table, which held a display of baskets of apples. Apples flew everywhere.

Without stopping or looking back, they all managed to reach the plane in time for their nearly missed boarding, all but one. He paused, took a deep breath and experienced a twinge of compassion for the girl whose apple stand had been overturned. He told his buddies to go on without him and told one of them to call his wife when they arrived at their home destination and explain his taking a later flight.

Then he returned to the terminal where the apples were all over the floor. He was glad he did. The 16-year-old girl at the apple stand was totally blind! She was softly crying, tears running down her cheeks in frustration, and at the same time helplessly groping for her spilled produce as the crowd swirled about her, no one stopping or to care for her plight.

The salesman knelt on the floor with her, gathered up the apples, put them into the baskets, and helped set the display up once more. As he did this, he noticed that many of them had become battered and bruised; these he set aside in another basket. When he had finished, he pulled out his wallet and said to the girl, "Here, please take this \$20 for the damage we did. Are you okay?" She nodded through her tears.

He continued on with, "I hope we didn't spoil your day too badly."

As the salesman started to walk away, the bewildered blind girl called out to him, "Mister...." He paused and turned to look back into those blind eyes. She continued, "Are you Jesus?"

He stopped in mid-stride, and he wondered. Then slowly he

made his way to catch the later flight with that question burning and bouncing about in his soul: "Are you Jesus?"

Do people mistake you for Jesus? That's our destiny, is it not? To be so much like Jesus that people cannot tell the difference as we live and interact with a world that is blind to His love, life and grace. If we daim to know Him, we should live, walk and act as He would. Knowing Him is more than simply quoting Scripture and going to church. It's actually living the Word as life unfolds day to day.

You are the apple of His eye even though we, too, have been bruised by the fall. He stopped what He was doing and picked you and me up on a hill called Calvary and paid in full for our damaged fruit.

Story Behind The Song...

"Just As I Am"

Charlotte Elliott, 1789-1871

This song has been called "the world's greatest soul-winning hymn." It has been used for years by evangelist Billy Graham as a hymn of invitation for people to "come just as you are" bringing their load of sins to the Lord, repenting of them and having Him wash them completely away.

The author of the hymn, Charlotte Elliot, was known as "carefree Charlotte" during her younger years. But at the age of 30 she contracted a serious illness that left her an invalid until her death at age 82. Many times her weakened condition left her depressed about her inability to do things. One such time was when her brother H.V. Elliot, a pastor, was raising funds for St. Mary's Hall in Brighton, England. St. Mary's was a college for daughters of poor clergymen, and Charlotte was sad that she could not help due to her physical condition. The words spoken to her in a fourteen-year-earlier visit from Swiss evangelist, Dr. Caesar Malan, came back to her, "Charlotte, you must come just as you are - a sinner - to the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."

She wrote a poem based on those encouraging words that she felt may help others who were limited by physical conditions. The poem first appeared in *The Christian Remembrancer*, of which Miss Elliot became editor in 1836. Not long after its publishing, a lady whose heart it touched greatly had the

poem printed in leaflet form and distributed it widely. One day while visiting a very ill Miss Elliott, her physician gave her one of the leaflets in an effort to bring her comfort (he had no idea she was the author). Tears streamed down her face as she was told that copies of the poem were being sold to raise funds for St. Mary's Hall. God had indeed used her, "just as she was," to make a significant contribution toward the building of the school.

It's a great reminder that God doesn't ask us to do what we aren't capable of doing. But he does ask us to simply give him what we have - with the promise that He can use that in great ways.

It is impossible to know how many people have been brought to Jesus through the words of that poem-turned-hymn. Her brother said this, "In the course of a long ministry, I hope I have been permitted to see some fruit of my labors, but I feel that more has been done by a single hymn of my sister's."
