

Question for Pastor...

Can you go to hell for telling a lie?

This is a sincere and honest question that displays a couple things we don't see much of any more: The Fear of the Lord and a belief that there is a hell. I'm going to answer this question in two parts. This month I'll tackle the "fear of the Lord" aspect. Next month we'll deal with hell.

For starters, maybe I need to clarify what "fear of the Lord" really is (and isn't), after all it is a pretty important thing. Many of you will remember that Martin Luther's explanation of the commandments in The Small Catechism all began with the words We should fear and love God that... And in His word (in the Psalms and Proverbs) God tells us "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." i.e. You can't have wisdom apart from a foundational fear of God.

So what does it mean to "fear God"? It doesn't mean you should be terrified of him like you would be of an escaped criminal who is on the loose in your neighborhood. Someone who will bring harm randomly and without provocation. No. That's not what God is like. He never randomly brings consequences unprovoked.

The fear of God is this: A healthy respect for who He is (God) and what He has the right, power and authority to do.

It's quite comparable to how we "fear" the person in the Highway Patrol car. We have nothing to fear from that person when we are obeying the law. But when we drive by that car doing 70 in a 55 zone, well, the instant sweaty palms and rapid heart rate indicate

a fear of what the person in that car has the right, power and authority to do. We also find a comparison between the motivation the Highway Patrol person has for pulling us over and God's motivation for bringing consequences when we disobey His rules: Both looking out for our best interests (even though we may not think so at the time).

I was in a store this week talking with the shopkeeper when another customer came in. The topic the three of us ended up discussing was the declining state of morals in our world - and the increasing acceptance of ideas and actions God specifically denounces in the Bible. We didn't agree on the root cause of this situation (I still contend that the root cause is the same as the root cause of the original moral failure in the Garden of Eden: Satan has been successful in getting us to believe his lies). But we did all agree on this one thing: There is very little fear of God in our world these days. And without the fear of the consequences that God has the right, power and authority to bring (for our own good) we end up using "whatever feels right at the time" as a guide for our actions instead of using God's word. And our feelings serve as an ever-changing and unreliable guide as to what is the right thing to do.

I'll go into the second part of the answer in greater detail next month when I tackle the "hell" issue, (hint: contrary to popular belief there is a place of eternal suffering and separation from God) but I don't want to leave anyone in the dark on this point: On Good Friday, Jesus did *everything* that ever needed to be done to keep anyone from having to be separated from Him for eternity. He died to forgive *all* sin - including lying. And God promises that everyone who repents of their sin and trusts in Jesus and what He did on Good Friday and Easter Sunday will spend eternity in with Him in heaven. That's the Good News we celebrate every Sunday.

New Mentoring Program...

In light of the recent suicides in our community, people in churches have been meeting to plan for ways to help our young people through the tough times they face. The Living Word Elders' Team put together initial plans for starting a Mentoring program in our congregation. We will share information about the program during the lunch at the Sunday School Picnic on Sunday, May 22 but here are some preliminary details about the program:

- The basic goal will be to match each young person in our congregation (middle school through high school) with an adult from the congregation who will serve as a mentor.
- Mentors will simply serve as an adult the student can develop a trusting relationship with - someone in addition to their parents that they can feel comfortable talking with. (No formal teaching)
- We will attempt to match mentors with students based on mutual interests and experiences.
- Mentors will be making the following commitments:
 *A face-to-face meeting with your student at least once a month
 *Touch base' with the student at least once per week (call or text)
 - *Attend a monthly meeting of mentors
- *Attend events your student is involved in (plays, concerts, games)
- The mentoring relationship will continue throughout the years the student is in school - we will not be assigning new mentors each year (unless the specific situation - such as a move - warrants)
- Good Mentor candidates will ...
- *Above all display a willingness to be part of a young person's life
 - *Be "real"
 - *Not be perfect
 - *Help the student connect with God
- *Do this because they "want to" not because they feel they "have to"
- If there is sufficient interest we would also like to have mentors for students who are in college or are recently out of high school. These mentoring relationships would not have as much face-to-face time.

On Television...

Lutheran Hour Ministries' 'The Bible on Trial' to Air on Television in May

Type the phrase "most scrutinized book in history" into your favorite Internet search engine and your results will point to just one title: the Bible.

A collection of 66 individual books written down by more than 40 authors over a span of a thousand years, the Bible makes a single claim according to Christianity: its central character, Jesus of Nazareth, is the Son of God, promised by God, sent by God...and raised from the dead by God to redeem all human-kind from sin and everlasting condemnation.

For centuries, the veracity of that claim and its source has been challenged. Skeptics assert that the biblical narratives are mere stories; that biblical texts must have been corrupted in the process of copying and re-copying; that the names of many key biblical characters are not found in non-biblical historical records; that the biblical canon was determined by a biased Christian council in the fourth century A.D., and so on.

The Bible on Trial rises to the challenge.

Lutheran Hour Ministries, in partnership with Envoy Productions, is proud to present The Bible on Trial: Beyond a Reasonable Doubt, a full-length broadcast program for television.

Story Behind The Song...

"All Creatures of Our God and King"

God reminds us in Psalm 19 that all the magnificent wonders of nature reveal His majesty and glorify Him. From the grateful heart of a devoted Italian monk came the beautiful message of this song. As a lover of nature, Francis of Assisi saw the hand of God in all of creation. He urged others to respond with expressions of praise and alleluias.

Giovanni Bernardone, the given name of St. Francis, demonstrated in his own life the tender, humble, forgiving spirit and absolute trust in God that this hymn urges us to have. At age 25 Bernardone left an indulgent life as a soldier, renounced the wealth he'd inherited and determined to live meagerly and imitate the selfless life of Christ

Throughout his life Francis appreciated the importance of music in the life of the church and encouraged singing in the monastery. He wrote more than sixty hymns for this purpose. A prayer written by St. Francis has become familiar and well-loved:

Lord, make me an instrument of Thy peace.
Where there is hatred, let me sow love
Where there is injury, pardon. Where there is discord, unity.
Where there is doubt, faith. Where there is error, truth.
Where there is despair, hope. Where there is sadness, joy.
Where there is darkness, light.
For it is in giving that we receive.
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned.
It is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

His beautiful expressions of praise in "All Creatures of Our God and King" have also endured for nearly 900 years.

All creatures of our God and King,
Lift up your voice with us and sing,
Alleluia, Alleluia!
Oh, burning sun with golden beam,
O silver moon with softer gleam,
O Praise Him, O Praise Him, Alleluia, Alleluia!
