

Question for Pastor...

What does the Bible say about homosexuality?

I liked this question, because it gets us right to the place we ought to be going for our answer: God. You know, it really doesn't matter what your neighbor thinks about it or what some guy who kicks a football for a living thinks or what your favorite celebrity thinks or what the politicians think. The bottom line on



Come November 6 when we dose the curtains behind us at the polling booth and have to figure out how to vote on the Marriage Amendment (which would define marriage in our state's constitution as between one man and one woman), the guiding question must be: "What does God say?"

Some people may have well-reasoned arguments. Others (it seems like most) just resort to name calling. Yet others rush to put their words into God's mouth, "God would....."

It seems the only smart thing is to let God speak for Himself on the issue. And God *has* spoken - quite plainly. Here's what He tells us in His word

Leviticus 18:22-23

22 You shall not lie with a male as with a woman; it is an abomination. 23 And you shall not lie with any animal and so make yourself unclean with it, neither shall any woman give herself to an animal to lie with it: it is perversion. (i.e. "Not the way I created you to be")

1 Corinthians 6:9-20

9 Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, 10 nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. 11 And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

12 "All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be dominated by anything, 13 "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. 14 And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. 15 Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! 16 Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two will become one flesh." 17 But he who is joined to the Lord becomes one spirit with him, 18 Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body. 19 Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, 20 for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

Romans 1:25-32

They exchanged the truth about God for a lie, and worshiped and served created things rather than the Creator—who is forever praised. Amen.

26 Because of this, God gave them over to shameful lusts. Even their women exchanged natural sexual relations for unnatural ones. 27 In the same way the men also abandoned natural relations with women and were inflamed with lust for one another. Men committed shameful acts with other men, and received in themselves the due penalty for their error.

28 Furthermore, just as they did not think it worthwhile to retain the knowledge of God, so God gave them over to a depraved mind, so that they do what ought not to be done. 29 They have become filled with every kind of wickedness, evil, greed and depravity. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit and malice. They are gossips, 30 slanderers, God-haters, insolent, arrogant and boastful; they invent ways of doing evil; they

disobey their parents; 31 they have no understanding, no fidelity, no love, no mercy. 32 Although they know God's righteous decree that those who do such things deserve death, they not only continue to do these very things but also approve of those who practice them.

1 Timothy 1:8-10

We know that the law is good if one uses it properly. 9 We also know that the law is made not for the righteous but for lawbreakers and rebels, the ungodly and sinful, the unholy and irreligious, for those who kill their fathers or mothers, for murderers, 10 for the sexually immoral, for those practicing homosexuality, for slave traders and liars and perjurers—and for whatever else is contrary to the sound doctrine.

Matthew 19:5-6

"Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' 5 and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? 6 So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

Based on those passages we can safely conclude the following:

- Homosexual behavior is prohibited in both the Old and New Testament
- 2) Homosexual behavior is contrary to the Creator's design.
- 3) Marriage is the lifelong union of one man and one woman.

That should help with guidance for the voting booth, but what about guidance for the other times in life? Here's one final, all-important conclusion:

4) Homosexuality is but one of *many* things God did not create us to engage in. Remember the end of the 1 Timothy passage - "and for whatever else is contrary to the sound doctrine"? I think those of us for whom homosexuality is not a temptation tend to forget that the sins which are temptations for us are also not part of God's plan. (And, just because we are tempted by certain things doesn't mean *God made me that way* or that being tempted by certain things gives us permission to follow those temptations.)

The key response to all of these sins - induding the ones that trip you up - is not to somehow try to make God "ok" with those actions. The key response is the same as it has always been: Repentance - admitting that we have not followed God's plan and seeking His forgiveness and His help to "turn around and

turn away" from these actions in the future.

Never forget this: Jesus has already purchased forgiveness for us by taking the punishment for all sins on the cross. And God has already given us His Holy Spirit to help us with the "turn away" part. That's how He shows His true love for us, not by "changing His mind" and being "ok" with something we are doing that is not good for us.



October Discipleship Verse...



"I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes..." Romans 1:17

E-Mail Wisdom... (received via e-mail)

Pastor's Note: This story reminded me that we often give up too easily on finding ways to do what God calls us to do. There are often many ways to accomplish something, but we tend to quit when the first way doesn't work. The story also reminds me of something my mom used to say, "If there's a will, there's a way."

There are SEVERAL ways to solve a problem. For example, consider the following from "The Teaching of Elementary Science and Mathematics" by Alexander Calandra:

The process of creativity is a mysterious and interesting one. It is brilliantly described in the following story. A student refused to parrot back what he had been taught in class. When the student protested, I was asked to act as arbiter between the student and his professor.

I went to my colleague's office and read the examination question: 'Show how it is possible to determine the height of a tall building with the aid of a barometer.'

The student had answered: 'Take the barometer to the top of the building, attach a long rope to it, lower the barometer to the street and then bring it up, measuring the length of the rope. The length of the rope is the height of the building.'

A high grade is supposed to certify competence in physics, but the answer did not confirm this. I suggested that the student have another try at answering the question. I gave the student six minutes, with the warning that his answer should show some knowledge of physics. In the next minute he dashed off his answer, which read: 'Take the barometer to the top of the building and lean over the edge of the roof. Drop the barometer, timing its fall with a stopwatch. Then, using the formula $S = \{frac\ 1/2\}a\{sp\ 8\}t(2),\ calculate\ the\ height\ of\ the\ building.'$

At this point, I asked my colleague if he would give up. He conceded, and I gave the student almost full credit.

In leaving my colleague's office, I recalled that the student had said he had other answers to the problem, so I asked him what they were.

'Oh, yes. There are many ways of getting the height of a tall building with the aid of a barometer. For example, you could take the barometer out on a sunny day and measure the height of the barometer, the length of its shadow, and the

length of the shadow of the building, and by the use of a simple proportion, determine the height of the building.'

Fine, I said. And the others?

'Yes. Take the barometer and begin to walk up the stairs. As you climb the stairs, you mark off the length of the barometer along the wall. You then count the number of marks, and this will give you the height of the building in barometer units. A very direct method.'

'Finally, there are many other ways of solving the problem. Probably not the best is to take the barometer to the basement and knock on the superintendent's door. When the superintendent answers, you speak to him as follows: "Mr. Superintendent, here I have a fine barometer. If you will tell me the height of this building, I will give you this barometer".'

"Discipleship 101"

One thing has not changed even though we are in a new building:

Our mission. Which is: To make disciples.

The best way to help other people become disciples of Jesus is to be a disciple, so they know what one looks like. Here's what we've discovered on recent Sundays from God's Word:

- A disciple's goal is to "get filled with the dust from his master's sandals." i.e. follow closely behind Jesus all day long, spending so much time watching what He does that we become like Him.
- 2) Jesus was a humble servant. Disciples need to be the same. Humility means "making whatever sacrifice is necessary to put someone else first - even if it means you get to be last."
- 3) Jesus was focused. He couldn't be distracted from "being about His Father's business." Focus on doing God's work in all aspects of our lives is a goal for us disciples as well.
- 4) Disciples are branches that "bear fruit" attracting people to the Vine (Jesus). Just like God made different trees to bear different kinds of fruit, He has made us with different gifts, talents and interests to serve Him.



Story Behind The Song...

"10,000 Reasons (Bless the Lord)"

by Matt Redman

"10,000 Reasons (Bless the Lord)" is a new worship song we've sung recently a few times at Living Word. From comments I've heard it seems to be an "instant favorite" for many people. If you listen to any of the Christian radio stations you've no doubt heard it as well.

WL: Please share the specifics of writing "10,000 Reasons (Bless the Lord)"and what was on your heart as far as the theme and focus?

Redman: I wrote this song with a great friend, Jonas Myrin. He's a Swedish guy who I've sat down to song-write with lots over the last few years. He played me an idea for some of the chorus melody, and I found it immediately inspiring. In fact, it felt like a perfect fit for a song based on the opening of Psalm 103. The song came together really quickly—a good chunk of the song was actually a spontaneous moment. I have no idea why some songs take months of writing and re-writing (like "Blessed Be Your Name") and others arrive really swiftly (like this one). One thing I've realized over the years is there's no

distinct rule that says that something composed quickly must therefore be more spiritual or inspired! Yes, God-breathed inspired worship songs can at times be written very quickly and spontaneously—but at other times they've involved a lot of perseverance, perspiration, and hard work!

I've always loved Psalm 103 and how the writer lists all of these brilliant reasons why his heart is full of worship for God: he heals our diseases, redeems our lives from the pit, crowns us with love and compassion, etc. So in the verses of this song we try and make a little list of our own-noting of course that we're hardly even scratching the surface of God's worth—there are "10,000 Reasons" for our hearts to find. With anyone or anything else, that would be an outrageous overstatement. With Jesus, it is a huge understatement. The point behind the song is this: if you wake up one morning and you cannot think of a reason to bring God some kind of offering of thanks or praise, then you can be sure there's something wrong at your end of the pipeline, and not his. We live beneath an unceasing flow of goodness, kindness, greatness, and holiness, and every day we're given reason after reason why Jesus is so completely and utterly worthy of our highest and best devotion.

The Psalm:

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name!

- 2 Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits,
- 3 who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases,
- 4 who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,
- 5 who satisfies you with good, so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.
- 6 The Lord works righteousness and justice for all who are oppressed.
- 7 He made known his ways to Moses, his acts to the people of Israel.
- 8 The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.
- 9 He will not always chide, nor will he keep his anger forever.
