## Question for Pastor...

"If you could spend one day with someone - living or dead - who would you choose to hang out with ?"

This question was one I read in a Twins-Orioles program back in April when Becca and I went to a ball game in Baltimore. It was in an article where the Orioles PR people made an attempt to give fans some insights into the lives of the players. I was surprised to see George Washington's name pop up more than once. I was also pleased to see that at least one Oriole player (first baseman Chris Davis) chose Jesus as the person he'd most like to spend a day chatting with. (Just a coincidence that Davis is the guy who is leading the league in home runs???)

It's fun to find out who ball players would like to spend a day with, but it doesn't take too long before you make the jump and start to ponder the question on a personal level. At the end of this article I'm going to give you instructions on where you can leave your answer. But since this is "Questions for Pastor" I will first give you my answers.

I must say that I really couldn't narrow my answer to just one person.

On a personal level the name that popped into my mind first was that of my dad Albert. How many times in the past dozen years since dad went to be with Jesus haven't I wished that dad was here to share a ballgame with or work on the car or paint a house with?! I'd like to spend a day with my dad, just because he was the best dad a guy could ever have.

But then I thought, "The person I really should spend a day with is

my mom." I'd spend a day with my dad ... for my sake. But, I really should spend a day with my mom... for her sake. I'd like to spend a day with mom to tell her how much I appreciated all the things she did as 'mom.' (And to apologize for being a jerk to her so many of those times she was just being 'mom.')

Then I moved on to the 'professional level' and thought about who I'd like to spend a day with. Being a writer, the first name that popped into my head was C.S. Lewis. I'd love to pick his brain about how he makes the Christian faith so easy to understand in his writings. He seems to have more insights and profound statements about Jesus than anyone I've read.

And, of course, like Chris Davis, I'd like to spend a day with Jesus. Having been a pastor for close to twenty years, I feel like I know Jesus a little better than maybe the average person on the street (or the ballpark). But I have one question for Him the answer to which would likely fill up a whole day: "What have we got wrong?" i.e. What have we misunderstood, misinterpreted or just flat-out messed up?

There are lots of things I know we have right. Like the fact that Jesus is God-in-the-flesh. The fact that sorrow over sin and faith in Him is required to receive the ticket to eternity He purchased with His blood on the cross. The fact that all who do trust in Jesus will rise from our graves to live and spend that eternity in His visible presence. (And many, many more things). But I also know it would be quite arrogant and misguided to assume that a sinful human being has understood God - His will, what He likes, what He is like, His plans - perfectly.

In fact, one of the things that strikes me about Jesus' dealings with people in the gospels is that He is constantly 'taking to task' religious folks (like the Pharisees) who pridefully think they've got it all right. Jesus seems much more patient with folks who humbly admit that they don't have it all right - but who come to Him to find what is.

So, how about you? Who would you like to spend a day with - and why?



God's plans are so beyond my comprehension and understanding. When He puts desires in my heart, I often picture them looking one way, but it turns out, God's plans are completely different.



As some of you might remember, last August I met Chris, the director of Life Raft International. He introduced me to a family of Christian refugees from Pakistan, and since then, I have dedicated myself to working for Life Raft International, an or-



ganization that enables ordinary people to transform the lives of urban refugees.

I have stepped into the lives of people living in desperation, hunger and the fear of death, to the point that these people have become my best friends. As lifechanging as that has been, it has been even more meaningful to see hope rise and faith abound as church communities have come together to care for and empower the refugees.

Because Life Raft directs all of their available money to meeting refugees' basic needs, they have been unable to pay me. However, I have dedicated myself to their work because I believe in their model: ordinary people helping the needy through intentional, loving relationship.

Life Raft's work has grown to the point that the current challenge is raising money to support our families. Over the past months, I have even had to start working almost full-time as an English teacher, just so that I can cover my own expenses that my pledged support does not cover. Page 20

## Story Behind The Song...

"Shine, Jesus, Shine"

Shine Jesus Shine, Graham Kendrick's best known song was written in 1987 and has proved to be enduringly popular not just in the UK but all round the world. It deposed 'Jerusalem' from the BBC's Songs of Praise Top Ten Hymns survey and consistently appears as one of the top songs in the CCL (Church Copyright License) chart both in the UK and USA.

In a recent interview Graham said:

"This song is a prayer for revival. A songwriter can give people words to voice something which is already in their hearts but which they don't have the words or the tune to express, and I think 'Shine Jesus shine' caught a moment when people were

beginning to believe once again that an impact could be made on a whole nation."

Graham explains how the song came together...

"Bearing in mind the worldwide popularity of this song, perhaps the most surprising thing about the writing of it is the ordinariness of the circumstances. I had been thinking for some time about the holiness of God, and how that as a community of believers and as individuals. His desire is for us to live continually in his presence. My longing for revival in the Churches and spiritual awakening in the nation was growing, but also a recognition that we cannot stand in God's presence without 'clean hands and a pure heart'. So I wrote the three verses and 'road tested' it in my home church. Though there was clearly merit to the song, it seemed incomplete, so as I was unable at the time to take it any further, I put it back in the file. Several months later I was asked to submit new songs for a conference song book, and as I reviewed this three verse song I realized that it needed a chorus. I remember standing in my music room with quitar slung round my neck trying different approaches. The line 'Shine Jesus Shine' came to mind, and within about half an hour I had finished the chorus, all but some 'polishing'. Though I felt an excitement in my spirit at the time, I had no inkling at all that it would become so widely used. There were other songs I rated more highly at the time that most people have never heard of!"

'Shine Jesus Shine' has been sung at numerous high profile occasions such as; The Dunblane Memorial Service, Tasmania massacre memorial service - broadcast live nationwide, Prom Praise, Billy Graham crusades, and the largest ever open air mass in Manilla where the Pope "swung his cane in time to the music"!!
