Question for Pastor...

Does He Mean That Literally ?

Recently in our study on angels, right before we read a verse that gives us the impression that we may have specific angels assigned to guard us - "guardian angels" - we read this:

If your hand or your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life maimed or crippled than to have two hands or two feet and be thrown into eternal fire. 9 And if your eye causes you to stumble, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life with one eye than to have two eyes and be thrown into the fire of hell.

Matthew 18:8-9 (NIV)

The question above came after reading those two verses. Was Jesus really meaning that we should cut off hands and feet and pluck out eyes?

I don't think so. He's simply using a literary device we all use when we talk with friends. It's called "hyperbole" - exaggeration to make a point.

For example, if I told you "I'm so hungry I could eat a horse," would you go out and immediately contact the authorities to come and take me away? Would you call the folks across the road from church and tell them to get their horses in from the yard real quick-like? Of course not. You would know that I'm not really intending on going horse hunting in order to get a meal. I've made an exaggerated statement to drive home the fact that I'm REALLY hungry - maybe in a more memorable way than simply stating "I'm really hungry."

Jesus wants His disciples (that includes us) to recognize just how deadly sin can be, so instead of making a statement they may not remember like, "Sin is very dangerous, guys," He puts it in terms they will likely never forget.

How do we know that's what Jesus is doing and that He's not being literal? Well, if Jesus was being literal with that statement we would expect many Bible accounts of things like: "... and Peter went around blind for the last thirty years of his life, having plucked out his eyes to keep from sinning." We have no such stories. Nor should we expect any, because Jesus was simply driving home the point in a very vivid and memorable way, that sin is to be avoided at all costs. I'm guessing those are a couple verses, graphic though they may be, that we would all do well to commit to memory.

The Marriage Enrichment Retreat is History....

... but History is something we are supposed to learn from. So we are including

some things we learned at the retreat.

We've highlighted the first 3 of 5 keys for having a successful marriage:

- Never forget that you are a TEAM (with God as your coach)
- Don't forget this truth: Men and Women ARE Different by design!
- Teammates must constantly communicate don't assume you know!

This month's key: Teammates work together to fight CONFLICT (not each other)

Two things to remember about conflict in your marriage.

1) Conflict is NATURAL (not "bad").

Because God intentionally made us different, we will naturally have different ideas, preferences and experiences. These differences cause conflict. It's going to happen naturally.

You must work TOGETHER to defeat the conflict, not your spouse.

A "Twelve-Step" Conflict Resolution program

(From - mostly - Ephesians 4-5)

- PRAY Where two or three are gathered together, there am I in their midst
- A solution may seem impossible on your own, but you're not on your own.

2. LOVE RULES

"Speak the Truth - IN LOVE" (you are a team!)

3. REMOVE SELFISHNESS

"Put off the Old Self" (SELF-ISH)

4. BE SELFLESS (like God)

"Put on the New Self" (SELF-LESS)

Love often requires sacrifice. It did for God.

8. DON'T TEAR DOWN Let no unwholesome talk come out of your mouth only what is helpful for building up."

- No name calling.
- Focus on behaviors, not motivations or character e.g. "You don't care about me...." is focusing on a motivation "You're an idiot" (Name calling /character assassination)

9. REIGN IN EMOTIONS

"Get rid of all bitterness, rage, anger..."

 Do whatever it takes to keep emotions at bay.. e.g. Take a walk first

10. FORGIVENESS -

Be kind and compassionate, forgiving each other

. Ask for it and give it (the most Christ-like thing you can do)

11. BRAINSTORM SOLUTIONS

List possible solutions & pick one to try.

12. SCHEDULE A 'CHECKUP'

Set a specific date see if it's working. If not, try another solution.

Highlights from our study: "Angels - God's Secret Agents"



- Angels are Ministering Spirits.
- They minister (serve)
 God by serving those who trust in Him.
- The word "angel" means "messenger." And one of the chief ways they serve is by bringing messages. e.g.

Gabriel brought the message to Mary that she would give birth to the Son of God.

- "The heavenly host" literally is an "Angel army." Another way angels serve is fighting battles against Satan and his fallen angels (demons). E.g. Revelation 12.
- Angels guard things as in Genesis 3
- Angels serve by protecting us. It was an angel that shut the mouths of the lions to protect Daniel.
- Angels are powerful beings NOT chubby little toddlers with tiny wings. The common response to seeing an angel is something like "Oh, no. I'm a dead man!" NEVER does someone see an angel and say, "Qoooh, cute!"
- They exercise their power in many ways read about how one 'broke' Peter out of Jail in Acts 12.
- Humans don't become angels when we die, but our spirits are escorted into heaven by angels at our death.
- Angels spend lots of time worshiping God (read Revelation 7:11-12 and try to picture that scene in your mind.)
- Angels worship, but are not to be worshiped. (See Revelation 22.)
- Angels have power to rescue us at any time. But just because they can doesn't mean they always will, because there is a time for everything under heaven including a time to suffer and a time to die. Jesus said in Matthew 26:53 that He could have called on 12 legions of angels, but didn't, because it was His time to die.

Suggest a "Thank God For ..." Message





OF CHRISTIAN PARENTING DAILY DOZEN #8 Don't Buy Into the Lies of Society - Part 2

(Remember who is behind the lies of society: Satan - "the Father of Lies")

Satan, through our culture, lies to us with the idea that when it comes to spiritual matters we need to be

"consumers" and search out the things we like, instead of listening to God's plan for us spiritually. The following is a quote from the *Daily Dozen* workbook

Consumers, by definition, choose whether, when and where to purchase. The most important principle in consumerism is that everything is up to me. I make every decision based upon "what I'm getting out of it." When a thing no longer entertains me, interests me, or serves me, I discard it, abandon it or give up on it. When we apply that to our Christian faith we come up with some very wrong notions. For example, the idea that we no longer need to attend church every week. (....because it doesn't always entertain me or give me what I want)

Bill was a 17-year-old who wept in my office, because he missed the fact that his family didn't worship consistently (as a family) at his church. His tears really impacted me (and his mom) and I started thinking about the importance of regular public worship and how it is the antidote to spiritual consumerism.

Some parents buy into spiritual consumerism when they say to me: "I can find God at the lake or in the woods, Jim, so I don't need to go to church on Sunday." I delight that people can find God at the lake and in the woods. So can I. I love watching the sun dance on the lake during a beautiful summer day. I can also find God by walking in the woods, hiking, mountain climbing, biking, talking to a friend, getting lost in a leaf, walking on the beach, etc.. I just love nature!

But the question about weekly public worship is not about where I can find God (that can be a form of spiritual consumerism). It is rather about what God wants me to do as His creature. God created me. I didn't create God. God tells me what's best, not the other way around. God tells me that He wants me to worship publically every week, and Bill missed that because His parents had slowly bought the lie of spiritual consumerism.

Story Behind The Song...

"America the Beautiful"

As we approach our Independence Day celebrations this song gives us a great reminder not to take for granted the country God has blessed us with.

Katherine Lee Bates, who was a teacher and head of the English department at Wellesley College in Massachusetts penned the original text of this song in 1893., while teaching summer school in Colorado Springs. She was inspired by the Rocky Mountains and Pikes Peak in particular. The poem America was published two years later to commemorate Independence Day. The tune Materna was composed by church organist and choirmaster Samuel A. Ward. The poem was first set to the tune in 1910 and published

She once said, "We must match the greatness of our country with the goodness of personal godly living. If only we could couple the daring of the Pilgrims with the moral teachings of Moses, we would have something in this country that no one could ever take from us."

The song is revered for highlighting the scenic beauty of our nation, the courage of those who settled our nation as well as the sacrifices made by all who have fought to make and keep it free. But the song also encourages us to pray for our nation, as each stanza concludes by asking God to bring His grace, heal-

ing, refining, goodness and unity to our nation's people.

The original version of the poem *America* is printed left column and the song as we know it in the right. You'll notice guite a few revisions.
