Question for Pastor...

What's your favorite hymn?

Our organist, Sharon Willen, asked me this question a couple months ago. One of the other churches she accompanies was having a "March Madness"-style tournament to determine that congregation's favorite hymn.



That's a question with no "easy" answer. That's because the answer will likely change every time I'm asked that question.



For example, if I fielded that question in December, my answer would most likely be "Hark the Herald Angels Sing." It does a masterful job of describing what really happened when Christ was born. e.g. "God and sinners reconciled." (Plus, it's the song the kids sing at the end of A Charlie Brown Christmas after Linus recites from Luke chapter 2 reminding them what Christmas really is all about!)

If I were asked around Easter "Jesus Christ is Risen Today" would get my vote-based on the rousing tune that really helps us get into celebrating the greatest event in all of history.. "I Know That My Redeemer Lives" would win out if words were the main criteria. In all eight verses that hymn reminds us what Jesus' resurrection really means for our everyday lives.

"What A Friend We Have in Jesus" is another favorite, and may be the greatest reminder we have of the power of prayer - and the peace God

brings through it. The hymn title is also what my father chose for his and mom's gravestone.

"How Firm a Foundation" is also a great song with an easy-to-sing tune. It reminds us that God's Word is the rock on which to build a solid life. It contains, in my estimation, one of the greatest verses of comfort and hope ever penned:

The soul that on Jesus hath leaned for repose, I will not, I will not desert to it's foes.

That soul, though all hell shall endeavor to shake, I'll never, no never, no never forsake.

The refrain of Solid Rock (in our hymnal it's titled My Hope is Built on Nothing Less) has a much needed reminder that everything other than Jesus in which we can place our trust will eventually crumble:

"On Christ the Solid Rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand."

The answer I gave off the top of my head the moment Sharon asked was "Be Thou My Vision." That answer is based largely on the tune - which probably is my all-time favorite (From All That Dwell Below the Skies is a very close second) - although the words are also a great reminder of the difference that focusing on Jesus makes in life.

If you were to ask me that question a week from now, I just might name a hymn that has slipped my mind today, one whose words are a perfect fit for the situation that day.

The answer to the above question, I assumed, was limited to the more traditional songs in hymnals. But, if I were to be able to include some of the contemporary songs..... well, that's a question for another month.







LC-MS Presidential Election Results

This past month the congregations of the LC-MS re-elected to a third term the Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, who received 56.96 percent of the votes cast. The voters in the president's election were the congregations' delegates in attendance at the 2015 district conventions (Pastor David and Keith Hanson for Living Word).

The results of the balloting are as follows:

Harrison (current LC-MS President) 3,507 votes - 57 %

Rev. Dr. Dale A. Meyer (Concordia Seminary Pres.) 2,257 votes - 37%

Rev. Dr. David P.E. Maier (Michigan District President) 393 votes - 6%

Story Behind The Song...

"The Solid Rock"

aka: "My Hope is Built on Nothing Less"

Pastor's Note about the song.

In a sermon last month I referenced a line from this hymn that has always stuck in my brain, because it so accurately sums up the correct attitude we need about heaven and our place in it:

"No merit of my own I claim, but wholly lean on Jesus' name."

Here's the story behind the song from Then Sings My Soul - 150 of the world's greatest hymn stories.

Edward Mote was born into poverty on January 21, 1797 in London. His parents were innkeepers who would not allow a Bible into their home. Nevertheless, Edward heard the Gospel as a teenager and came to place his faith in Jesus. He eventually became a skilled carpenter and owner of his own cabinet-making shop.

"One morning," he recalled, "it came into my mind as I went to labor to write a hymn on the 'Gracious Experience of a Christian.' As I went up to Holborn I had the chorus: On Christ the Solid Rock I stand / All other ground is sinking sand. In the day I had four verses complete, and wrote them off."

"On the Sabbath following I met brother King... who informed me that his wife was very ill, and asked me to call and see her. I had an early tea and called afterwards. He told me that it was his usual custom to sing a hymn, read a portion and engage in prayer before he went to meeting. He looked for his hymnbook but could find it nowhere. I said, 'I have some verses in my pocket; if he liked we could sing them.' We did, and his wife enjoyed them so much that after service he asked me, as a favor, to leave a copy for him and his wife.

"I went home, and by the fireside composed the last two verses, wrote the whole off and too them to sister King... and these verses so met the dying woman's case, my attention to them was more arrested, and I had a thousand printed for distribution."

In 1852 at age 55 Edward gave up carpentry to pastor the Baptist Church in Horsham, Sussex where he ministered 21 years.

The four verses as printed in our hymnal:

My hope is built on nothing less Than Jesus' blood and righteousness No merit of my own I claim, But wholly lean on Jesus' name.

Refrain: On Christ the Solid Rock I Stand All other ground is sinking sand

When darkness veils His lovely face, I rest on His unchanging grace In every high and stormy gale My anchor holds within the veil (Refrain)

His oath, His covenant and blood

Support me in the raging flood When every earthly prop gives way, He then is all my hope and stay (Refrain)

I trust His righteous character His counsel, promise and His power; His honor and His Name's at stake To save me from the burning lake. (Refrain)
