# Ouestion FROM Pastor...

"Would you die for Jesus?"

Every now and then I switch the Question FOR Pastor to a Question FROM Pastor. That's the case this month.

The question above is one that came up in Violet's 3-4th Grade Sunday School class. It came up after Violet mentioned that history tells us all of the disciples (except John) were killed for proclaiming their faith in



The Bible recounts for us in Acts chapter 7 that the first martyr (a word whose original meaning is 'witness'!) was Stephen, one of the men the disciples had chosen to be a deacon in the church at Jerusalem. The Bible also tells us that James, son of Zebedee was the first disciple to lose his life for being a follower of Jesus.

It's a question that, not long ago, may have seemed an abstract question with the common idea that being killed for faith in Jesus "wouldn't happen here." But that 'couldn't happen here' thought had to be reevaluated in 1999. Some of you may remember the school shooting at Columbine HS in Colorado that year. It was reported that one of the students was asked by the killer if she believed in God - and then was shot because she answered 'Yes.' The recent movie I'm Not Ashamed was based on that girl's life and her faith in Jesus.

We now live in a world where far too many people think nothing of killing Christians. Just last week 20 Christians were killed in Egypt, specifically because they were Christian.

It's not an easy question to answer. We all hope that our answer would be "Yes." But then we might also be afraid we'd be like Peter who, the day before Jesus died, boldly stated in Matthew 26:33, "Even if all [the other disciples fall I way on account of You. I never will." And then, the very next day, denied (3 times!) that he even knew Jesus. But after witnessing Jesus risen from the grave, that same apostle Peter did die for Jesus - even asking to be crucified upside down, not feeling worthy

to die in the same manner as his Lord had died.

The students in that Sunday School class and Violet answered, "Yes," when they asked each other that question.

God grant us all the courage to do the same- with the remembrance that death could not keep Jesus down, and He promises that same resurrection to eternal life for all who have faith in Him.

I know Memorial Day is past, but EVERY day is a good day to remember those who gave their lives and those who serve now.....

### STOP TO SALUTE

EAGLE BASE, Bosnia and Herzegovina (Army News Service, May 22, 2002) -- It was raining "cats and dogs," and I was late for physical training. Traffic was backed up at Fort Campbell, Ky., and was moving way too slowly. I was probably going to be late and I was growing more and more impatient.

The pace slowed almost to a standstill as I passed Memorial Grove, the site built to honor the soldiers who died in the Gander airplane crash, the worst redeployment accident in the history of the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault). Because it was close to Memorial Day, a small American flag had been placed in the ground next to each soldier's memorial plaque.

My concern at the time, however, was getting past the bottleneck, getting out of the rain and getting to PT on time. All of a sudden, infuriatingly, just as the traffic was getting started again, the car in front of me stopped. A soldier, a private of course, jumped out in the pouring rain and ran over toward the grove.

I couldn't believe it! This knucklehead was holding up everyone for who knows what kind of prank. Horns were honking. I waited to see the butt-chewing that I wanted him to get for making me late.

He was getting soaked to the skin. His BDUs were plastered to his frame. I watched as he ran up to one of the memorial plagues, picked up the small American flag that had fallen to the ground in the wind and the rain, and set it upright again. Then, slowly, he came to attention, saluted, ran back to his car, and drove off.

I'll never forget that incident. That soldier, whose name I will never know, taught me more about duty, honor, and respect than a hundred books or a thousand lectures.

That simple salute -- that single act of honoring his fallen brother and his flag -- encapsulated all the Army values in one gesture for me. It said, "I will never forget. I will keep the faith. I will finish the mission. I am an American soldier."

I thank God for examples like that. And on this Memorial Day, I will remember all those who paid the ultimate price for my freedom, and one private, soaked to the skin, who honored them.

# Story Behind The Song...

His Eye is On the Sparrow (From "Then Sings My Soul" by Robert J. Morgan)

Jesus frequently referred to bird-life in His sermons, saying things like: "Are not two sparrows sold for a copper coin? And not one of them falls to the ground apart from your Father's will," (Matthew 10:29)

"Do not fear... you are of more value than many sparrows." (Luke 12:7)

"Look at the birds of the air, they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your Heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? (Matthew 6:26)

It was verses like these that caused the author of "God Will Take Care of You" to write, a year later, another great hymn about God's care: "His Eye is on the Sparrow."

Civilla Durfee Martin was a Canadian by birth, born on August 21, 1869 in Nova Scotia. She became a school and music teacher, but when she married Dr. Walter Martin, an evangelist, she gave up teaching to travel with him and assist in his meetings. The following is her account of the writing of this song:

Early in the spring of 1905, my husband and I were sojourning in Elmira, New York. We contracted a deep friendship for a couple by the name of Mr. And Mrs. Doolittle— true saints of God. Mrs. Doolittle had been bedridden for nigh twenty years. Her husband was an incurable cripple who had to propel himself to and from his business in a wheel chair. Despite their afflictions, they lived happy Christian lives, bringing inspiration and comfort to all who knew them. One day while we were visiting the Doolittles, my husband commented on their bright hopefulness and asked them for the secret of it. Mrs. Doolittle's reply was simple: "His eye is on the sparrow, and I know He watches me." The beauty of this simple expression of boundless faith gripped the hearts and fired the imagination of Dr. Martin and me. The hymn "His Eye is on the Sparrow" was the outcome of that experience."

The day after writing the song, she mailed it to the famous Gospel composer Charles Gabriel, who penned the music.

Why should I feel discouraged, Why should the shadows come Why should my heart be lonely And long for Heav'n and home, When Jesus is my portion? My constant Friend is He: His eye is on the sparrow, And I know He watches me; His eye is on the sparrow, And I know He watches me.
