Ouestion for Pastor...

When can we get back to church?

Unfortunately, the answer to that question keeps changing. But as it stands right now, we should be able to hold worship inside our building on May 24.

You will initially see some changes due to the temporarily stricter health guidelines during COVID-19. Including...

Start Time: This change has nothing to do with the virus. Last fall

> our Mission and Ministry team voted to change our summer worship time to 9:00 a.m. from Memorial weekend through Labor Day weekend. So worship will begin at 9:00 a.m. (For those who come and watch the worship video on your vehicles, our "parking lot" worship will also start at 9:00 a.m. on May 10th &

17th.)

Entrance/Exit: Ushers will open door for people coming and going to

be propped open if weather permits.)

In keeping with "social distancing" guidelines we will Seating:

utilize every-other pew, so we are able to keep 6 feet of

distance between families

Bulletins/hymnals Again, to keep touchable surfaces to a minimum we

will be projecting the order of worship, songs and announcements onto the front wall instead of using bulletins or hymnals. (To make this happen, we will need help from people familiar with PowerPoint.)

Greeting time: We will not have a 'handshake' greeting time.

Offering: Offering plates will not be passes. A stationary basket

for offerings will be placed by the door.

Communion: Will be served using pre-packaged wafer/cup

combinations. Common cup will not be offered.

Fellowship:

We will not have coffee/lunch fellowship after worship until social distancing guidelines are ease

There may be other changes in procedures, but those are the main ones

One very positive result of our Stay at Home time has been the great response to having our worship able to be viewed online. With that in mind, we will be continuing to record the services for online viewing by people unable to attend. 

From MN North District...

Dear Friends in Christ.

Rahm Emanuel served as the Chief of Staff under President Obama. He is credited with the idea that you should "Never let a crisis go to waste." By that, he meant that there are real opportunities to effect changes during a time of crisis. Charles Doyle of the University of Georgia, co-author on the forthcoming Yale Book of Modern Proverbs. has found that this expression is now commonly applied to economic or diplomatic crises that can be exploited to advance political agendas, but he traced it back at least as far as 1976, when M. F. Weiner wrote an article in the journal Medical Economics entitled "Don't Waste a Crisis — Your Patient's or Your Own." Weiner meant by this that a medical crisis can be used to improve aspects of personality, mental health, or lifestyle. (August 13, 2009 blog written by Fred Shapiro).

Personally, I turn to Romans 8:28: "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose." That doesn't mean that all things are good, but God can work good in all things.

I do not take glee in the crisis we are in — but I know that God can, and does work all things for good, for those who are called according to His purpose.

So what good can come out of a pandemic? In an April 2, 2020, opinion piece in the Jerusalem Post by Joel C. Rosenberg entitled; "Millions of Americans say coronavirus a 'wake-up call' from God" reports "a

stunning 44% of Americans polled said they see 'the global coronavirus pandemic and economic meltdown' as 'a wake-up call for us to turn back to faith in God,' as 'signs of coming judgment."

In the March survey, 22% of non-Christians polled said that the crisis is causing them to start reading the Bible and to listen to Christian sermons online even though they usually do not search online to learn more about Bible prophecy and God's plan for the future of mankind and have more spiritual conversations with family and friends.

40% of self-identified Christians report to be reading their Bible more than ever and watching or listening to Biblical teaching and Christian sermons online since they cannot go to church.

The survey was conducted by McLaughlin & Associates, a nationallyrespected polling company, from March 23 through March 26. The

questions were asked of 1,000 likely American voters. The poll had a reported margin of error of +/- 3.1%, at a 95% confidence interval.


Remember the Teal's Rebate Program.

away the bitterness that Renee felt. It wasn't until Renee visited the driver, Eric, in prison and forgave him that she was able to experience true freedom from the anger she harnessed inside. Not only that, but Renee petitioned the judge to cut Eric's sentence in half. He now joins her speaking around the country on the dangers of drunk driving.

West said of Renee, "She lost her daughter because a drunk driver got behind the wheel of his car one night and crashed into her daughter's car," said West.

"That young man is the reason, she'll never see her daughter again. That young man was sentenced to 22 years in prison for the crime he committed. Renee wrote to me about how she was the one who felt like a prisoner because she had all this bitterness, hatred and anger in her heart towards that young man." said West.
