

Question FROM Pastor...

What lesson has God used His creation to teach you recently?

I find that God often uses His creation to teach us spiritual truths. I got one of those lessons not long ago when I was mowing lawn. We had been without rain for a couple of weeks, but most of the grass in the back yard was still growing nicely, healthy, green and thick and definitely in need of cutting.

I was mowing along when all of a sudden I came upon this rather large round spot where the grass was getting brown, dry and definitely not as healthy as everything else around it. My first thought was "Aliens have landed in my backyard." (You've seen those pictures of round, bare spots in fields where people claim alien space ships have supposedly landed...)

Anyway, that humorous thought lasted only a second or two until I looked up and saw the trampoline nearby. Then I remembered that round spot is where the trampoline had been sitting a few weeks back. The grass under the trampoline had been shielded from the sun for quite awhile until I moved it. The grass in that circle was alive but it sure wasn't doing well. It wasn't growing and it wasn't healthy. All because it hadn't been getting enough sun.

It dawned on me that the same kind of thing happens to us when we are shielded from the Son - Son - for an extended period. Life is like that round patch of grass in my yard - kind of dry, not full and just plain not doing too well. We're alive

but not healthy and not growing - something's missing. (The Son). But when we get the Son back in our lives, He revives us and we start to grow and become healthy again.

Next time you find yourself being shielded from the sun in the s, let that be a reminder to ask yourself if you are being shielded from God's Son. Are you letting Him shine into your life by praying, reading His Word, coming to worship, hanging out with Christian friends? Or are you being shielded from Him?

Revelation: The Letters (and beyond)

Last week we began our study of the book of Revelation. Numbers are very significant (and very symbolic) in the book of Revelation. For example, the number 7 occurs all over the place and is symbolic of God's perfect time (based on the seven days He used to create a perfect world). The book of Revelation includes seven "beatitudes" or statements of blessing. The first occurs right away in the third verse of the book and sets the tone for the whole book:

Blessed is the one who reads the words of this prophecv, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, because the time is near.

There's a lot wrapped up in that one sentence:

- 1) We should not (as many people seem to) be afraid to Revelation, because God promises a blessing just for the reading of it.
- 2) It is not "beyond understanding" (again, as many people seem to think). If that were the case, we would not be able to "take to heart" what we read. It's tough to take something to heart if you can't understand it.
- 3) The purpose of the reading it is not simply to gather information to satisfy curiosity. Rather, God has given the information in Revelation for the purpose of effecting a change in our attitudes and actions. (To "take something to heart" means to let it have an affect on your life - to let it change the way you think and act.)
- 4) Revelation is prophecy. Prophesy is often wrongly interpreted to mean "mysterious prediction of the future." But "prophesy" simply means "a message from God." Sometimes that message may include predictions of the future, but those predication are not the main purpose. The main purpose of prophesy is always to inform God's people of a message He has for them... SO THAT they will "take it to heart" and change the way they act or think.
- So, guys, here's an invitation to receive the blessing God promises for reading and taking to heart His message in Revelation. We meet on Wednesday evenings (5th and 19nd this month). Please ioin us - and bring a friend.

Greetings in the name of our Living Lord!

We are starting a new year of our "Secret Paul" program and encourage you, as a parent or grandparent, to fill out the form below to have the child(ren) and young adults in your family participate.

Program overview

The "Secret Paul" program came about as a way for our church to be involved in the lives of the young people of our congregation and to be for them what a church should be - a caring, extended family. We are now starting the second year of the program. After the end of the first year, many of those that had been praying noted what a positive - even gratifying - thing it was to be praying for a specific young person, knowing what a difference these prayers can make.

The name "Secret Paul" comes from the fact that the Apostle Paul was noted for praying for other believers every day. Praying for such things as their protection, the growth and action of their faith, even prayers of thanks for these other believers. 

The Story Behind the Song...

"What a Friend We Have in Jesusl"

Joseph Scriven's life was full of promise. He was born in Dublin, Ireland in 1819 to wealthy parents. He received the best schooling and eventually graduated from prestigious Trinity College. Along the way he met and wooed the most beautiful girl in the world--at least that's what he thought of her. She said Yes, and the world lay at his feet.

Then the evening before their wedding day, tragedy struck. His beautiful, young fiancée accidentally drowned. Scriven was so shocked and saddened, he couldn't find comfort. And so he left home and began to wander the world, hoping to forget his deep sorrow. By the time he finally decided to settle in Canada, he was 25 years old.

Scriven had been raised in the church, but over the years he had fallen away. Now in his deep despair he turned to religion for survival. It often happens that a person turns back to God when they are at the end of their rope.

The young man took his recommitment to the Lord seriously and decided to make the Bible his rule for living. He read Jesus' words that those who help the poor are in fact helping the Lord, so he decided to make it his ministry to help the needy. He began by giving away most of what he owned. He even shared the very clothes off his back, when necessary. People who observed him said that he never once refused to help anyone who needed it.

Often he would walk along the streets of Port Hope, Ontario, carrying a saw and a sawhorse, ready to help anyone in need. Most of the time he worked without pay. The residents of the town considered him a kind man, even though some of them thought he was a little odd.

One day, a rich man saw Scriven and said to a friend, "That man looks like a sober man. I think I'll hire him to cut wood for me." The rich man's friend replied, "That's Joseph Scriven. He wouldn't cut wood for you. He only cuts wood for those who don't have enough to pay."

By helping others, Scriven slowly began to start a new life for himself. Over time his sadness lifted and he fell in love again, this time with a wonderful Canadian woman. Then out of the blue tragedy struck a second time. Before they could marry, his fiancée died of pneumonia. Once again the people of the town saw him walking the

streets with his tools, ready to help wherever he was needed.

When he was 36 years old, Scriven received word that his dear mother, who lived in Dublin, was seriously ill. He didn't have the money to visit her, so he wrote her a letter of comfort. In the envelope he enclosed a poem that he had written. He called the poem, "Pray Without Ceasing." A while later when he himself became ill, a friend who came to visit happened to see the poem scribbled on scratch paper lying near his bed. His friend read the beautiful poem with great interest and asked if he had written the words. With his typical modesty, Scriven answered, "The Lord and I did it between us."

Joseph Scriven never intended for the poem to be published. But as fate would have it, the verse made its rounds. Several years later someone found the poem and set it to music. The new hymn was titled, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus."

In spite of the tragedies that stalked his entire life, Joseph Scriven had learned to make Jesus his dearest Friend, and this is what helped him bear his grief.

This song has special meaning for me as well. When my dad was ordering the gravestone for the cemetery plot he and my mom share, he asked me for suggestions about what to have inscribed on it. I told him that a gravestone was a great way to witness to your faith even after you are gone. So I asked, "What would you like everyone to know about God?"

Here's what he had inscribed: What a Friend We Have in Jesus.

Bible passages incorporated in the hymn:

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. [7] And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7

My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. [13] Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends. [14] You are my friends if you do what I command. [15] I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you.
