

Question for Pastor...

Questions About Prayer:

In a recent Bible study on the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5) I received several questions about prayer. Prayer seems to be one of those things people have lots of questions about. Here are just a couple questions and their answers.

Is it ok to talk to God when I'm walking?

The question comes from a sincere desire to pray in a way that is acceptable to God. That's a good desire. From the time we were young, how were most of us were instructed from parents or grandparents or pastors or Sunday school teachers before a prayer was offered? "Fold your hands and close your eyes." When we hear that before almost every prayer it's easy to get the idea that's the only way we can come to God in prayer. But in fact it's not. It's simply one way, not the only way.

I actually like the idea of talking to God while walking. It reinforces the truth that you can (and should) talk to God anywhere, anytime. It also reinforces the truth that you can talk to God like you would talk to someone walking alongside of you - because He truly is "with you always to the very end of the age." It seems to come easy to think of God as "way out there somewhere" and hard to think of Him as being someone who is close enough to walk beside you. Talking while walking can be a good way to pray.

That's not to say that folding your hands and closing your eyes isn't a good posture for prayer. It is. Maybe, especially good for children. It helps us focus our attention on God and not get distracted while talking to Him.

When I pray before bed do I need to kneel by my bed?

How many paintings or movies have you seen of where someone is kneeling beside a bed praying? I know I've seen more than a few. The impression can be given that this is the only way to pray before bed.

Kneeling while praying is a great posture for prayer. Kneeling is naturally humbling. It's a posture that says, "I don't deserve to be coming to you with this request. I don't deserve to be in your Presence. I acknowledge you as my King and appreciate you listening to me." Humility, respect and acknowledgment of God as King are essential attitudes to have when we approach Him. Kneeling can help with that, but it's never been prescribed by God as the only posture we must have before praying - let alone praying before bed.

That The World May Know...

Notes from Meeting With District Mission & Ministry Rep.

On Monday, November 29, Pastor Dave Strohschein, our Mission and Ministry Facilitator from the district office met with our Mission and Ministry Team to talk about plans for the upcoming year

He talked about our building plans and shared with us some information about loans from LCEF (Lutheran Church Extension Fund). Pastor Strohschein told us that we could qualify for a \$250,000 loan (but wouldn't recommend that level of debt). Our building committee would like to keep our monthly building expense at (or lower) than the \$1210/month we currently pay for rent. Pastor Strohschein informed us that borrowing \$92,000 would give us a monthly payment (principal and interest) of \$600. He also told us that before we could get a loan from LCEF we would have to demonstrate the ability to stay current with our basic expenditures (he estimated six months of staying current).

He challenged us with two goals:

- Develop a plan to address the on-going struggle to stay current on basic expenditures.
- Develop a plan to address how to get to the point of construction of a facility on the property owned by Living Word.

Living Word has been receiving mission funding from our district since the congregation was formed in 2005. Pastor Strohschein presented possibilities for continued mission funding for one more year: He guaranteed us support of \$4567.80 (an amount that has already been donated and designated for Living Word). He informed us that he will also request an additional \$6852 to help cover the Concordia Health plan expenses for Pastor Dauk. Receiving any amount over the guaranteed \$4567.80 will be contingent upon the pledges district receives from its congregations. The amount of those pledges normally isn't known until mid January.

Pastor Strohschein shared some words of encouragement....

He congratulated us on "growing in the grace of giving" as we've gone from offerings of \$1150/week in 2009 to \$1450/week this year. He mentioned that level of giving is very good for a congregation of our size. He also encouraged us to move ahead with building plans. When asked what we needed to do to grow, he told us that we've been doing a lot of the right things in an effort to reach out. Then he challenged us to raise our "IO" (our Invitation Quotient") by having everyone make it a priority to invite people to Bible studies, worship and fellowship activities. He shared with us the challenge his former congregation in St. Cloud faced when their building program called for a loan of one million dollars, and members were saving, "There's no way we can do that." Pastor Stroschein said that admission was a good thing, because it opened the door for God to come in and do what they couldn't. He said it refocused their trust away from themselves and onto God.



Inspirational Story...

Once upon a time, there was a man who looked upon Christmas as a lot of humbug. He wasn't a Scrooge. He was a very kind and decent person, generous to his family, upright in all his dealings with other men. But he didn't believe all that stuff about an incarnation which churches proclaim at Christmas. And he was too honest to pretend that he did.

"I am truly sorry to distress you," he told his wife, who was a faithful churchgoer, "but I simply cannot understand this claim that God became man. It doesn't make any sense to me."

On Christmas Eve, his wife and children went to church for the midnight service. He declined to accompany them. "I'd feel like a hypocrite," he explained. "I'd much rather stay at home. But I'll wait up for you."

Shortly after his family drove away in the car, snow began to fall. He went to the window and watched the flurries getting heavier and heavier.

"If we must have a Christmas," he reflected, "it's nice to have a white one."

He went back to his chair by the fireside and began to read his newspaper. A few minutes later, he was startled by a thudding sound. It was quickly followed by another, then another. He thought that someone must be throwing snow balls at his living room window.

When he went to the front door to investigate, he found a flock of birds huddled miserably in the snow. They had been caught in the storm, and in a desperate search for shelter had tried to fly through his window.

Story Behind The Song...

"O Come, O Come Emanuel"

"All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

Matthew 1:22-23

"O Come, O Come Emanuel" is a song that bridges the seasons of Advent and Christmas. In fact, in some hymnals this song is listed in the "Advent" section and in others it is listed in the "Christmas" section. The hymn, of Latin origin in the twelfth century, is one of oldest that we sing.

It was originally used in the liturgy of the church in medieval times as a series of antiphons - short musical statements sung for the vespers ("evening") prayer services the week prior to Christmas Eve. Each of the antiphons begins with the plea for the Messiah to come using a different title by which He is referred in the Scriptures

The antiphons of the song were translated from Latin into English by John M. Neal (1818-1866).Mr. Neal was co-founder of the Society of Saint Margaret, an order within the Anglican Church dedicated to nursing the sick. He also wrote original texts that became the well-known Christmas carols Good King Wenceslas and Good Christian Men Rejoice.

The melody for the verses is also of ancient origin - possibly dating back to the 8th century. It is based on one of the earliest forms of sacred melody known as Chant or Plainsong.

O come, O come Immanuel, And ransom captive Israel That mourns in lonely exile here. Until the son of God appear.

Chorus:

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to thee O Israel.

O come Thou Lord of Might, who to Thy tribes on Sinai's height In ancient times didst give the law in cloud and majety and awe.
