

Question for Pastor...

What dreams do you have for the future growth of Living Word?

This is a question similar to the one on cards handed out to everyone who attended our Dedication Service. On that card we were looking for answers that are a bit more specific to God's purposes for our *building*:



My Vision / Dream for the future of this building is

If you weren't able to attend the dedication or didn't come up with an answer to put on your card, you still have a chance. We'll be collecting those "Dream/Vision" cards the next few Sundays. We will then add them to the "Time Capsule" that we are putting together to give future members of Living Word a glimpse of what was going on in our congregation at the time our new facility was dedicated. It will be interesting to open the Time Capsule 15 or 20 years down the road and see how many of the building dreams and visions became reality.

Back to the question above. That question was posed to me by Rev. Mike Ruhl who heads up the Missouri Synod's Center for U.S. Missions. Some of you met Pastor Ruhl when he was here in 2011 for our Strategic Planning Weekend.

I had three (at least) answers for that question. Here's the first - and in my mind, the most important:

My first dream is that we would be known in the community as a church that leads people to a life-changing relationship with Jesus - not a place where people just "go through the motions of

church"

After all, the purpose of Living Word is to make disciples for Jesus. A disciple is someone who seeks to

- 1) Know Jesus (not just know stuff about Him),
- 2) Grow to be like Jesus, and
- 3) Go into their world to help others do the same.

Knowing Jesus, growing to become like Him and going to share Him with others is indeed life-changing.

This kind of life-change happens best as people get involved in small groups within the church. Groups that get together for study, for fellowship and for undertaking service projects. In fact, a member of one of our study groups made this comment recently, "Being a part of this study group has changed my life." That's not a coincidence. That's how God works and that is our goal.

My second answer:

That Living Word would grow numerically to a place where we are able to move onto Building Phase 2 within five years.

A couple of the "Building Dreams and Visions" cards came back with similar answers. One example, "My dream is that this building would quickly become too small."

When Pastor Strohschein, who preached for our Dedication Service, asked what our Dedication Sunday theme was going to be, I told him, "We're not done yet." (i.e. "We aren't celebrating the 'end' of our project, but rather the 'beginning' of what God has planned to do in, with and through us."

Phase 1 of our Building Project was simply to get us "started." It was designed to be a multi-purpose space that would accommodate worship, fellowship, and classes but was not designed to be adequate for any of these long-term. Phase 2 will add a dedicated worship space and will allow us to transform the Phase 1 area into more dedicated classroom and fellowship space.

My final answer:

That Living Word would build on its "Family-Friendly" reputation and be able to add a Christ-Centered Pre-school or a homeschool center.

The best time to start making disciples is when those disciples are little. Kids are not the future of the church, they are part of

the church right now.

Discipleship 101

One thing has not changed even though we are in a new building:

Our mission is still - and always will be -To Make Disciples.

The best way to help other people become disciples of Jesus is to *be* a disciple, so they know what one looks like. Here's what we've discovered on recent Sundays from God's Word:

- +) Disciples FORGIVE others even when we don't feel like it. That's what disciples do, because it's what Jesus did for us. The story of Joseph reminded us that God always has the power to take bad things done to us and make something good come from it. It also reminded us to leave revenge in God's hands. Our task? Simply forgive.
- +) The most basic characteristic of disciples is LOVE. But not love as society defines it based solely on feelings. Love as God defines it: Doing what the other person needs you to do even when you don't feel like it.
- +) Disciples are in a battle everyday with Satan whose goal is to destroy our lives now and eternally. His tactic is always the same: he lies. He tells us that 'bad' is 'good' and 'good' is 'bad'. The only way that we can fight his lies is with truth. God's word is that truth. We win with that truth.
- +) And a quick review from last month, disciples:

- Use their talents to "bear fruit" for Jesus

Story Behind The Song...

"Come Ye Thankful People, Come"

Ask people to name a Thanksgiving song and "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" would probably be among the top two answers. (The other being "Now Thank We All Our God") It was written for the English harvest festivals, a movable feast which varies according to the harvest time in different villages that celebrate it.

The hymn writer, Henry "Dean" Alford, is regarded as a gifted, Christian leader of the 19th century, a distinguished theologian and scholar. He was also a writer, poet, artist and musician. Born in 1810 in London, it was as a Greek scholar that Alford attained his greatest distinction. His four-volume edition of the Greek Testament, on which he labored for twenty years, became the standard critical commentary of the later nineteenth century

"Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" first appeared in Alford's Psalms and Hymns in 1844. Originally, it was meant to be a harvest song, and titled "After Harvest" with seven stanzas. Only four remained in common use. Of the hymns written by Alford

only "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" is still in use in most evangelical hymnals. A summary of the four remaining stanzas:

Stanza One - An invitation and exhortation to give thanks to God, in His earthly temple which is God's Church, and for His care and provision to humankind's needs.

Stanzas Two and Three – They are Alford's commentaries on the Parable of the Wheat and the Tares as recorded in the book of St Matthew.

Stanza Four — A prayer for the Lord's return, a culminating event that Alford sees as an ultimate show of God's goodness in His purpose of humankind's redemption.

The tune used for this hymn is "St. George's, Windsor" whose composer was George J Elvey, an organist who served as organist for 47 years at the historic, Royal Chapel at Windsor Castle in England. He originally composed the music for another text. In 1861, the tune first appeared with Alford's text in the Anglican hymnal, Hymns Ancient and Modern. He was knighted by Queen Victoria in 1871.

Come, ye thankful people, come - Raise the song of harvest home:

All is safely gathered in. Ere the winter storms begin. God, our Maker, doth provide, For our wants to be supplied: Come to God's own temple, come - Raise the song of harvest home.

All the world is God's own field, fruit unto His praise to yield; Wheat and tares together sown unto joy or sorrow grown. First the blade and then the ear, then the full corn shall appear;

Lord of harvest, grant that we wholesome grain and pure may be.

For the Lord our God shall come, and shall take His harvest home:

From His field shall in that day all offenses purge away, Giving angels charge at last in the fire the tares to cast; But the fruitful ears to store in His garner evermore.

Even so, Lord, quickly come, bring Thy final harvest home; Gather Thou Thy people in, free from sorrow, free from sin, There, forever purified, in Thy garner to abide; Come, with all Thine angels come, raise the glorious harvest home.


