# Question for Pastor...

What is a "virtue"?

This guestion came up during one of our recent Fruit of the Spirit studies after I had referred to one of the fruits as a "virtue."

Here's how I defined it:

A virtue is a quality or characteristic that is inherently good.

Any of the fruits of the Spirit would fall under that definition - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, self-control, etc...

But that definition gave rise to a conversation about the difference between a "virtue" and a "value."

We hear a lot about "values." It seems that "values" is a popular word every group wants to have connected with their cause. We are told to vote for this person or that person because they have "values." We are encouraged to support this group or that group because of their emphasis on "values."

The problem is that every person and every group has something they value. And not everything that is valued is good. For example, maybe a certain person values "winning at all costs," That's not really a good thing to value. Another group may value huge profits no matter how they are attained. Again, that's not a good value. It could be truthfully said Satan has "values." He values evil and deception. Neither of which are ever good.

The basic problem with values is that they are determined by us! We - individual human beings and groups of human beings - define

what is valuable to us. And because sin is a reality in all of humanity, that means not everything we value is going to be good.

I told the group that since a virtue is something inherently good, this means only the One who is inherently good (God) can truly determine what a virtue is. Honesty is a virtue. Forgiveness is a virtue. Justice is a virtue. Unconditional Love is a virtue. All of those things come from God.

Bottom line: Don't allow yourself to get fooled into believing in some 'cause' just because it claims to have "values." The real key is this: Is the value also a virtue - something inherently good - as defined by the One who is inherently good.

Thank God He hasn't left us in the dark concerning virtues. He's tells us and shows us in His Word the things that are inherently good, virtuous. So as you read or listen to God's word, see if you can pick out those things God would define as virtues - things He values, because they are inherently good.



# NEW Men's Study...

Starting Tuesday, February 3

Mormons: Who They Are and What They Believe

The Mormon Church (aka The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints) means different things to different people. From its feel-good, family-oriented TV commercials to its Grammy- and Emmy-winning Mormon Tabernacle Choir to its bicycling missionaries, the Mormon Church is high profile all the way. Founded in the early 19th century, this religious movement boasts more than 15 million members and 85,000 missionaries, ranking it in the top five of "Christian denominations" in the U.S., according to the National Council of Churches.

But what makes this group distinctive and how does it differ from other Christian churches? Questions like these and more are addressed in *Mormons: Who They Are, What They Believe* 

As a religious group, Mormons are no strangers to controversy. Let's see, special revelations from God, the murder of its founder, regional expulsion and opposition by various groups, polygamy, and a host of teachings and doctrine peculiar to itself and unlike mainstream Christianity-have all put Mormons on the fringe of Christianity.

This Bible study will look at the group's origins (Joseph Smith, the Book of Mormon, Brigham Young, and others); the discrepancy between Mormon beliefs and orthodox Christian teaching and faith; the meaning of some of its rituals (baptism of the dead, endowments for the living and dead, temple garments, celestial marriage); and the prominence of the temple in the life of a Mormon. It will feature comments from individuals who have been deeply immersed in the Mormon belief system. It will show how some, upon exiting the Mormon Church, found themselves bewildered and disillusioned, often cut off and ostracized by their families, ready to abandon religious faith altogether. Real-life stories from those on the inside and other expert commentary add depth and authenticity to this engaging study. Join us Tuesday evenings to explore this fascinating topic through Scripture-related passages and Internet links.




### Thank God For...

especially things we take for granted. Last week we thanked God for Pancakes! Let Pastor know how you'd complete that




# Who Can You Invite?...

# Email Inspiration...

#### A Super Bowl Blessing

In the end, Susan Wood went to the party because she couldn't bear to be home alone, not tonight. She needed to get out of the house and away from her own thoughts, if only for a few hours. Anything to take her mind off the worry, the panic, the indecision and the morning sickness.

So she walked to a friend's house — to escape, to watch the Saints take on the Colts and to view one of the most talked-about Super Bowl commercials in history. There were maybe 15 people at the party, but they were too busy talking and snacking and laughing to notice that Susan wasn't drinking, that she were a distracted look and a manufactured smile.

Earlier that, Susan told her boyfriend she was pregnant. Let's just say he did not react well. He saw the first pregnancy test; he insisted on a second. Abortion was the only option. Susan consented, if only to end the conflict. Then he left, and she walked to the Super Bowl party alone.

On the night of Feb. 7, 2010, during the first quarter of Super Bowl XLIV, Focus on the Family's "Celebrate Family, Celebrate Life" commercial aired for the first and only time. Pam Tebow appeared onscreen, reminiscing about her "miracle baby" — son Tim, the 2007-Heisman-Trophy-winner.

Susan, however, had never watched college football. Couldn't identify a single player. Except one. "A few weeks earlier, I was folding laundry alone and the TV was on ESPN," she says. "I was too lazy to change the channel and watched an entire special on Tim Tebow. Literally the only college player in the entire country I could have named or recognized."

The room fell silent while the commercial played. Instead of the strident anti-abortion ad that Susan, her friends and most of America were expecting, they watched a mother's heartfelt story about the survival of her infant son.

"I wanted to be critical," Susan says. "I wanted to bash this horrible 'anti-choice' commercial. But as we watched, everyone agreed that it was a positive commercial with an encouraging message — not one of judgment or condemnation."

As other ads aired, Susan kept thinking about the Focus commercial, and she felt a pit in her stomach. She remained at the Page 16 Page 17

party, talking and watching the game, but she couldn't get that ad out of her head.

The Tebows were speaking to me. They were talking about my situation. What am I going to do?

Back home, Susan searched the Web for the ad and for Focus on the Family. She found the commercial, plus an interview with Bob and Pam Tebow, Tim's parents. She learned that Pam had rejected a doctor's advice to abort her unborn son in the face of medical complications. She watched the commercial again, feeling like it was made just to reach her.

Susan emailed Focus on the Family. In return, she says, a Focus staffer responded with encouragement, information and hope.


"It was so nonjudgmental," Susan says. "She offered advice but didn't tell me I was wrong. I kept thinking about what she wrote, and the commercial, and what Tim's mom said in the interview, and it all just spoke to my heart.

"I made the decision to keep the baby."

The baby's father never came around. He raged, and threatened, then simply checked out. Sure, Susan had friends and relatives, but she would essentially raise her child alone.

Avita Grace was born that September. It was love at first sight.

Avita is 4 now, and she has brought joy, fun and faith to her mother's life. The little girl loves frilly dresses and bows in her hair, coloring books and talking about Jesus. As a working single mom, Susan now has less money, less sleep, less time, more laundry, more dishes and lots more cleaning. But it's all drowned out by the limitless love she's been given.



"I think about the commercial, Tim Tebow and the people from Focus daily," Susan says. "I am so grateful. If there hadn't been a Super Bowl commercial, if I hadn't been at the party, if someone had responded to my email in a different way . . . With transformed hearts, we express our faith in the way we live our lives. God's Spirit provides motivation and power to live the Christian life in a growing awareness of redeeming grace.


