

# Question for Pastor...

#### What exactly is this "Reset" thing?

This past September the Living Word Elders' Team set the following as one of their goals for 2017:



After researching several different studies, they chose the Reset study. It seemed to be the best fit for the time of year we wanted to hold a congregation-wide study (January).

A congregation-wide study serves a couple of purposes. First, it helps us all 'get on the same page'. Each of our groups will be doing the same study, plus the sermons on Sunday will focus on the topic covered in the study that week.

The second purpose, is to use this as an opportunity to help friends and neighbors get connected to Jesus. At the start of a new year most people are doing some kind of reflection on changes they'd like to make in their lives as they move forward. So why not invite them to a study that goes beyond the typical "New Year's Resolution" and gets at the heart of what we all need to change? (And taps into the power of the One who can really help us make those changes!) So, who do you know whose not connected to a church right now that you could invite?

You don't have to get involved in one of the small group studies to benefit from Reset. As I mentioned, the sermons on Sunday will focus on the topic of the week, and you'll benefit from hearing those. But I'd encourage everyone to pick one of the weekly study groups to join even if just for this 4-week study. It's a great way to get to know some of your Living Word family on a deeper level than just saying "Hi" during

#### Could You Host A Small Group Study This



# Email Inspiration...

Modern culture is full of good news/bad news jokes. For example, there is the one about the pastor who stood up on Sunday and declared, "The good news is we have enough money here this morning to pay off the church debt and to build our new building." Then he added, "But the bad news is, it is still in your pockets!"

In Romans 6:23, one of the most informative and inspirational verses in the Bible, we find some good news and some bad news. The bad news is that "the wages of sin is death." But the good news is that "the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

#### The Bad News

There is some bad news in this verse: "the wages of sin is death." The Greek word for sin is best understood as "missing the mark." The word picture describes an archer who shoots his arrow at the target and misses the bull's-eye. We all find ourselves here as "all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). We have all missed the mark, and the bad news is that its cost, or wage, is death.

A wage is what we get for doing something. We work a certain number of hours, and our employer pays us an agreed-upon wage. It is something we have earned, some-thing we deserve. It is something we have coming to us. The Bible says, "the wages of sin is death." It is strange how many men and women sin, thinking it is going to pay dividends of fun and pleasure. But Satan is a liar. Sin pays its wage all right, but its wage is death, which is separation from all that is good.

Payday is coming someday. That is the bad news. When we miss the mark, it costs us greatly.

#### The Good News

But the good news is this: "the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." It is a gift, a free gift that cannot be earned nor deserved.

We all remember the excitement of opening gifts as children around the Christmas tree. We did not have to pay for those gifts. We did nothing to earn them. We simply opened them and received them. A gift is the opposite of a wage. We earn and deserve our wages. We don't earn or deserve a gift. If we did, it would be a reward and not a gift.

How is this all possible? We still have to deal with the bad news. Jesus made the way possible for us by dealing with the bad news Himself. Two thousand years ago on a Roman cross outside the city walls



of Jerusalem, Jesus took the bad news and became sin for us. Yes, the wages of sin is death, and He died our death on the cross, paying the penalty for our sin. He paid the price, so now we can finish the verse with this good news, "but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." He made a way out of no way. Our



part is to receive this God-provided and free gift by faith alone in Him.

What a difference there is in these two bits of news! The bad news is that sin is costly, and it has a wage attached to it. The good news is that eternal life is free. It is God's gift to us. And that is no joke!

# Story Behind The Song...

O God, Our Help in Ages Past

Isaac Watts penned some of our best-loved hymns - including a Christmas favorite, Joy to the World (which he based, not on the Christmas story, but on verses 4-7 of Psalm 98).

O God, Our Help in Ages Past is a great song for starting the new year. It reminds us that we can trust God in the future, because He has always kept His commitments in the past. Appropriately, this song was played by the BBC on the radio as WWII was declared.

The verses were originally written as a paraphrase of Psalm 90 and was originally published in his book Psalms of David Imitated (as was Joy to the World). I

Our God, our help in ages past, Our hope for years to come, Our shelter from the stormy blast, And our eternal home.

Under the shadow of Thythrone Still may we dwell secure; Sufficient is Thine arm alone. And our defence is sure.

Before the hills in order stood, Or earth received her frame, From everlasting Thou art God, To endless years the same.

Thy Word commands our flesh to dust, Return, ye sons of men: All nations rose from earth at first, And turn to earth again.

A thousand ages in Thy sight Are like an evening gone; Short as the watch that ends the night Before the rising sun.

The busy tribes of flesh and blood, With all their lives and cares, Are carried downwards by the flood, And lost in following years.

Time, like an ever rolling stream, Bears all its sons away; They fly, forgotten, as a dream Dies at the opening day.

Like flowery fields the nations stand Pleased with the morning light.

The flowers beneath the mower's hand Lie withering ere 'tis night.

Our God, our help in ages past, Our hope for years to come, Be Thou our guard while troubles last, And our eternal home.
