Questions for Pastor...

What does God think of witchcraft and astrology?

These were actually two separate questions asked by confirmation students on an assignment I gave them to list "Questions I Have..." I lumped the two questions together, because they basically have the same answer.



And we don't have to speculate about the answer! God is about as explicit as He could be in Deuteronomy 18:9-12:

When you enter the land the Lord your God is giving you, do not learn to imitate the detestable ways of the nations there. Let no one be found among you who sacrifices their son or daughter in the fire, who practices divination or sorcery, interprets omens, engages in witchcraft, or casts spells, or who is a medium or spiritist or who consults the dead. Anyone who does these things is detestable to the Lord; because of these same detestable practices the Lord your God will drive out those nations before you.

Included in the things God considers "detestable" in the passage

- 1. Attempts to discover the course of future events from created things
- The use of magic to supernaturally influence people or events;
- Conjuring up spirits or consulting with the spirit world in an effort to have the future revealed.

Martin Luther gave a great summary of why these things are detestable to God: "All such people place their heart and trust elsewhere than in the true God." (In other words, worshiping created things instead of the Creator.)

People are increasingly attracted to supernatural sources of knowledge and power. One thing is certain: Any supernatural power or knowledge that is detestable to God, can't be from Him! That leaves only one other source: Satan!

Just as the Apostle Paul did with the folks in Athens who worshiped all sorts of false gods (see Acts 17:16ff), I'd use people's intrigue with the supernatural as a point of connection and then introduce them to the

One who has already shown that He has power over all other supernatural powers. Why settle for inferior supernatural power or knowledge when the Spirit (the "Holy" one) with superior power and knowledge actually wants to live inside you?!

I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know... his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come.

The Link June 2021 Updates

Ribfest 2021 was a huge success and we are finally settling back into a more "normal" routine after all the planning and preparation. There was close to 200 volunteer hours put in on the day of Ribfest as well as the rib teams that spent countless hours setting up and preparing for the festivities. After coming off a year without being able to have any large gatherings, we were thankful the event went off without a hitch and even more thankful to those who were able to be a part of making Ribfest 2021 so successful. Ribfest is our largest fundraiser and it went as smooth as we could have hoped!

In May, The Food Pantry welcomed 5 new families, served 18 children, 58 adults and 22 seniors. 1750 pounds of food was distributed and 612 pounds of food was donated from community members and churches.

The Wildcat Backpack Program is done for the school year, but we will continue to serve families as needed throughout the summer. If you know a family that could benefit from this program, please have them call Ashley at 320-354-5555.

Senior Food Delivery- The Link volunteers have been out delivering some food to seniors in that benefit from not going out and about. If you, or someone you know, is interested in learning more about this program please have them call Ashley at 320-354-5555.

The Link's Client Outreach program served 4 families in the month of May. Throughout the month, The Link was able to help with utility bills, rent payments, medical bills and gas for medical appointments. There was also a few families impacted by a fire that were able to utilize some household goods from the household exchange program.







We are also looking for a person to be the Make-a-Meal coordinator -



Story Behind The Song...

Independence Day is upon us so this is the perfect time to look at a patriotic hymn... "Faith of Our Fathers".

Most everyone who has sung or heard "Faith of Our Fathers" would be astonished to hear it is a Catholic hymn written by a Catholic priest. Yet so it is. Nor was it first written for American patriotism, although that is what it has become for its greatest popularity.

The composer, Father Frederick Faber, first an Anglican clergyman in England, entered the Catholic Church in 1845.

Faber wrote Faith of Our Fathers in 1849 to memorialize sufferings and persecutions endured by Catholics during Henry VIII and Queen Elizabeth's reigns. The first verse refers to that, but at the same time has a universal application, hence today's patriotic appeal: Faith of our Fathers! living still,/ In spite of dungeon, fire, and sword:/ Oh, how our hearts beat high with joy,/ Whene'er we hear that glorious word.

Printed in several Catholic sources, by 1853 the popular hymn arrived in America — in a Protestant hymnal, prompting a change to Faber's third verse beginning: Faith of our fathers! Mary's prayers / Shall win our country back to thee...was changed to: Faith of our fathers, faith and prayer / Shall win all nations unto thee... The verse appears that way in the St. Michael Hymnal todav.

In America, this Catholic hymn has largely come to be associated with patriotism. However, in its present form, the hymn is truly timeless and borderless (it can be sung by Christians in any time period and any geographic region) — it honors both the "Author of Our Faith" and any Christian who has risked their life for their faith and/or for freedom of religion!

As we pass through these days of remembering our fathers - those who have gone on before us - and the price that many of them paid for our freedom, may we remember that it is sometimes difficult to do right and to stand for truth and justice. You and I should be able to muster up the tenacity required to meet our just obligations and to refrain from those things that destroy and divide - even if the stars fall.

George Washington, who said, "It is impossible to rightly govern the world without God and the Bible."

John Hancock informed us that, "We recognize no sovereign but God, and no king but Jesus!"

Abraham Lincoln reminded us that, "My concern is not whether God is on our side; my greatest concern is to be on God's side. For God is always right."

"Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord." -Psalm 33:12

There are several versions of this song, but the most common lyrics are as follows:

Faith of our fathers, living still In spite of dungeon, fire and sword, O how our hearts beat high with joy Whene'er we hear that glorious word!

(Refrain) Faith of our fathers! holy faith! We will be true to thee till death!

Our fathers, chained in prisons dark, Were still in heart and conscience free; And blest would be their children's fate, If they, like them should die for thee:

(Refrain) Faith of our fathers! holy faith! We will be true to thee till death!
