Questions for Pastor...

"What book of the Bible would you recommend as a first book for a new Christian or someone interested in finding out about Jesus?"

Another great question! The Bible is a mini-library containing 66 books where do you start? The first book

(Genesis) is a great place to start to get the foundation for everything that follows, but for someone new to the faith and God's Word, I'd suggest they start with one of the Gospels that record for us the facts about Jesus' birth, life, ministry, death and resurrection.

John's Gospel is the book of the Bible that I've often recommended for people who are interested in finding out about Jesus. More than any other gospel, John highlights the fact that Jesus is the Son of God and was sent by the Father to save the world from sin, and that the proper response to Jesus is to "believe in him." That message is summed up in the passage most people have heard: John 3:16. It makes sense if the goal is for people to "believe in Jesus" and be saved, you'd want them to read the book that stresses over and over the desired response God wants from us is to "Believe in Jesus"


But as I read through - and watched - John's gospel during Lent it struck me that it might not be the best book to recommend to new believers, because one of the other characteristics of the Gospel of John is that it records lots of things Jesus said that would probably leave people unfamiliar with Jesus scratching their heads, wondering "What on earth does that mean?" For example Jesus telling Nicodemus he must be born again. We know what that means, but it probably sounds very odd to someone not familiar with the saving.

So, I started to think of which other Gospel I would have someone new to Christianity read. And I came up with Luke's Gospel. For a couple of reasons.

Right away in the first paragraph Luke tells us this:
 Since I myself have carefully investigated eventhin

"Since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the certainty of the things Page 3

you have been taught." Luke 1:3-4



Doesn't that make you want to read to find out what Luke's careful investigation uncovered?! Most people don't want to believe in Jesus "just because someone told them to." They want evidence based on research. Luke carefully researched the things people have heard about Jesus, so

that the reader might have full confidence that what he wrote is "Gospel truth."

- 2) Following that introduction Luke records for us the details surrounding Jesus' birth: The Christmas Narrative. Even people who weren't brought up as Christians have some knowledge of that passage. It's a great place for them to start. A point of connection.
- 3) Everyone likes stories. A parable is an "earthly story with a heavenly meaning," a story people can relate to that teaches an important spiritual truth. Luke records more of Jesus' parables than any other gospel. Including a couple that - again - even people unfamiliar with the Bible have likely heard: The Parable of the Prodigal Son and the Parable of the Good Samaritan. More points of connection!
- 4) Some of the other accounts that are unique to Luke's gospel should resonate with people new to the faith: Jesus' invitation to Zacchaeus in chapter 19; Jesus' pronouncing forgiveness for the people who are putting him to death; and Jesus' conversation with the thief dying next to him - both found in chapter 23.

You could not go wrong suggesting either John or Luke as a first book to read. If you'd ask me that question tomorrow, I might answer it with "John's gospel," again. But today my answer is "Luke." (With that in mind, I thought it would be appropriate for us to read through Luke's gospel for our Daily Bible Readings this month. You can find the list elsewhere in this Newsletter.)

A Minute for Couples...

Quality Time

Whether you're in a super busy season of life or you just want to make the most of the valuable time you spend together, here are three tips for increasing the quality of your "quality time":

Ditch your devices.

Yes, this means ALL the devices - your phone, TV, computer, tablet, etc. It's so easy to sit down and spend hours bingeing a new series, all the while hardly speaking or connecting with each other at all. So even if it's just for 15 minutes before you start watching, eliminate the digital distractions long enough for a meaningful interaction. You could implement a "no screens" rule during meals or while lying in bed to incorporate screen-free time into your daily routine.

Be in the now.

Eliminating external distractions is one thing, but getting your mind to focus on the present and not your never-ending to-do list can be another story. If you've ever spent time with someone whose mind is on a million other things, you've probably experienced the negative impact it can have. In order to truly go for quality time over quantity, make the effort to be all-in mentally. Helpful tip: Look the other person in the eyes while they are talking to you.

Spend time apart.

This sounds counterintuitive, but one tip for truly appreciating your time together is to not be "attached at the hip." April 2021 Updates

We did it! On March 1, we announced Minnesota FoodShare month was here and set a financial

goal of \$25,000. Almost immediately after the fundraiser began, community members started sending in donations and contacting us wondering what they could do to help. The fundraising ended on April 11 and the grand total of donations was \$36,478.30!! In this time, The Link also took in 2800 pounds of food! Thank you to all the wonderful donors for stepping up and helping us exceed our goal by over \$10,000! What an amazing community we are a part of! Thank you does not seem like enough! Every dollar and pound of food is used to help your neighbors in need! And even better, there is a match from the Minnesota FoodShare campaign to stretch those dollars even further!

In other exciting news, RibFest is ON and is set to take place on Sunday, June 13! We are currently looking for anyone that would want to sponsor the event. In March, The Food Pantry welcomed 14 new families, served 43 children, 48 adults and 14 seniors. 2468 pounds of food was distributed and 1646.5 pounds of food was donated from community members and churches.

The Wildcat Backpack Program continues to deliver to Prairie Meadows Headstart program and we also have a few families picking up their backpack food during the week. If you know a family that could benefit from this program, please have them call Ashley at 320-354-5555.

Email Inspiration...

John Harper was born to a pair of solid Christian parents on May 29th, 1872. It was on the last Sunday of March 1886 when he was thirteen years old that he received Jesus as the Lord of his life. He never knew what it was to "sow his wild oats." He began to preach about four years later at the ripe old age of 17 years by going down to the streets of his village and pouring out his soul in earnest entreaty for men to be reconciled to God.



As John Harper's life unfolded, one thing

was apparent...he was consumed by the word of God. When asked by various ministers what his doctrine consisted of, he was known to reply "The Word of God!" After five or six years of toiling on street corners preaching the gospel and working in the mill during the day, Harper was taken in by Rev. E. A. Carter of Baptist Pioneer Mission in London, England. This set Harper free to devote his whole time of energy to the work so dear to his heart. Soon, John Harper started his own church in September of 1896. (Now known as the Harper Memorial Church). This church which John Harper had started with just 25 members had grown to over 500 members when he left 13 years later. During this time, he had gotten married but was shortly thereafter widowed. However brief the marriage, God did bless John Harper with a beautiful little girl named Nana.

Ironically, John Harper almost drowned several times during his life. When he was two and a half years of age, he almost drowned when he fell into a well but was resuscitated by his mother. At the age of twenty-six, he was swept out to sea by a reverse current and barely survived, and at thirty-two, he faced death on a leaking ship in the Mediterranean. Perhaps, God used these experiences to prepare this servant for what he faced next...

It was the night of April 14, 1912. The RMS Titanic sailed swiftly on the bitterly cold ocean waters heading unknowingly into the pages of history. On board this luxurious ocean liner, there were many rich and famous people. At the time of the ship's launch, it was the world's largest man-made moveable object. At 11:40 p.m. on that fateful night, an iceberg scraped the ship's starboard side, showering the decks with ice and ripping open six watertight compartments. The sea poured in.

On board the ship that night was John Harper and his much-beloved six-year-old daughter Nana. According to documented reports, as soon as it was apparent that the ship was going to sink, John Harper immediately took his daughter to a lifeboat. It is reasonable to assume that this widowed preacher could have easily gotten on board this boat to safety; however, it never seems to have crossed his mind. He bent down and kissed his precious little girl; looking into her eyes he told her that she would see him again someday. The flares going off in the dark sky above reflected the tears on his face as he turned and headed towards the crowd of desperate humanity on the sinking ocean liner. As the rear of the huge ship began to lurch upwards, it was reported that Harper was seen making his way up the deck yelling "Women, children and unsaved into the lifeboats!" It was only minutes later that the Titanic began to rumble deep within. Most people thought it was an explosion; actually, the gargantuan ship was literally breaking in half. At this point, many people jumped off the decks and into the icy, dark waters below. John Harper was one of these people.

That night 1528 people went into the frigid waters. John Harper was seen swimming frantically to people in the water leading them to Jesus before the hypothermia became fatal. Mr. Harper swam up to one young man who had climbed up on a piece of debris. Rev. Harper asked him between breaths, "Are you saved?" The young man replied that he was not.

Harper then tried to lead him to Christ only to have the young man who was near shock, reply no. John Harper then took off his life jacket and threw it to the man and said "Here then, you need this more than I do..." and swam away to other people. A few minutes later Harper swam back to the young man and succeeded in leading him to salvation. Of the 1528 people that went into the water that night, six were rescued by the lifeboats. One of them was this young man on the debris. Four years later, at a survivors meeting, this young man stood up and in tears recounted how John Harper had led him to Christ, Mr. Harper had tried to swim back to help other people, yet because of the intense cold, had grown too weak to swim. His last words before going under in the frigid waters were "Believe on the Name of the Lord Jesus and you will be saved." Does Hollywood remember this man? No. Oh well, no matter. This servant of God did what he had to do. While other people were trying to buy their way onto the lifeboats and selfishly trying to save their own lives, John Harper gave up his life so that others could be saved.

"Greater love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends..." John Harper was truly the hero of the Titanic!
