Questions for Pastor...

"What was your faith life like as a kid - did you go to church every Sunday (or more often)?"

This month our 8-9th grade confirmation students will be interviewing various people - parents, elders, pastor - asking questions designed to help them find out what a commitment to follow Jesus looks like in



The short answer to the question they asked is "Yes, and yes." Our family, dad, mom and I, went to church every Sunday - and more often.

We had a Sunday routine in our home: Sunday School, Church and then Sunday Dinner at home. (We always had pancakes and sausage for Sunday dinner.) While we ate dinner we listened to The Lutheran Hour radio program. I can't ever remember missing church on Sunday except if someone was sick. There was no reason to miss church. There were no stores open. There were no school-sponsored sporting events. (And if there had been, I can say with 100% certainty that my mom would have had a rule: No church. No baseball. Period. End of discussion.)

When I was in elementary school, we still had something called "Release Time." That was when the public school would let kids - all kids - out of school an hour early every Wednesday afternoon to attend "Release Time Classes" at their churches. (And, of course the question will come, "What about kids who didn't go to church?" I literally didn't know any kids who didn't belong to a church, so that wasn't an issue when I was growing up.)

Release Time Classes for high school kids were confirmation instruction. For us younger kids it was kind of like Sunday School on Wednesday. By the time I was confirmation age the public school had quit "release time," so our confirmation classes were held on Saturday mornings.

We also had Sunday School classes for all age kids - from as young as three years old to seniors in high school. My dad started teaching Sunday School when I was three, so that I would have someone to go with me to Sunday School, since I didn't have any brothers or sisters to

go with. Dad taught Sunday School for the next 25 or so years. I remember that everyone liked Albert's class, because he was so easy going. He didn't yell like some other teachers when the kids would get distracted by, well, pretty much anything:)

At home my mom would read a daily devotion from The Portals of Prayer everyday before school and work. I would say prayers before going to sleep at night. I can't say that I read the Bible much back then - except to prepare for confirmation class. The King James Version was pretty much the only translation we had available, and, for me, the Shakespearian English it was written in may as well have been a foreign language. Later, my mom had gotten a modern-language paraphrase called The Good News Bible that put things into much easier-to-under English.

In short, from the earliest days that I can remember, God was a very central part of my life growing up. I thank God, literally, for my parents giving me that firm foundation!


After-Worship Fellowship



A Minute for Couples...

(from the Prepare-Enrich blog)

When you think about being curious, what comes to mind? Cats? Kids? George? All joking aside, curiosity is a trait that we don't often put a lot of thought into, especially as adults. While some people are naturally more inquisitive than others, striving to be more curious is not as common as say, working on being more punctual or organized. That's why you might be surprised to learn that curiosity can improve your marriage. Keep reading to find out how.

1. It helps you resolve conflict.

When you're working through an issue, making assumptions about your partner's behavior and intentions just adds fuel to the fire. It easily comes across as judgmental, which can set off a cycle of defensiveness - not ideal for a productive discussion. Curiosity is a great way to avoid jumping to unfair conclusions. For example, instead of saying, "You've been distracted all week. It's like you're not even trying to be present," you might lead with, "I noticed you've been really distracted this week. Is there anything going on?" Keep in mind, your tone and nonverbal cues need to align with a genuine sense of curiosity. A warm and caring delivery is much more likely to elicit a vulnerable and honest response from your spouse. In turn, you're more likely to have a meaningful conversation instead of getting sucked into an unproductive argument.

2. It helps you keep learning about each other.

In a long-term relationship, you might get to a certain point and feel as if you know everything about your partner. However, as individuals, you'll both change over time. A sense of curiosity helps you keep getting to know all aspects of each other, whether you've been together for three years or thirty. You gain insight and learn more about who they currently are instead of who they used to be or who you assume them to be. Ultimately, this helps you stay connected as you both grow.

3. It helps you understand each other's perspective.

When you disagree on something, working to understand where the other person is coming from helps broaden and enrich your own point of view. Leading with curiosity helps you do that. Similar to working through conflict, focusing on being curious is a foil to being dismissive or narrow-minded. Instead of focusing on changing each other's mind, curiosity helps you listen to understand instead of planning your next persuasive point.

4. It helps you have great conversations.

Podcasts are all the rage right now. At the core of a good podcast is an inquisitive host who asks questions that eligit thoughtful answers and spurs compelling conversation. Curiosity can do the same for you and

your spouse! Sure, there can be a sense of comfort and security in being able to sit in silence together, but that can't be all the time. Engaging in conversation, whether they're lighthearted and fun, deep and meaningful, or fiery and passionate, is one major way that you'll stay connected to each other over the course of time.

5. It helps you gain more insight and self-awareness.

In the midst of those great conversations, your partner is probably asking you questions that get you thinking and reflecting on your own feelings and behaviors. Their curiosity can lead you to learning more about yourself in ways you might not have otherwise. When you start thinking about things through a lens other than your own, you have the opportunity to unlock new insights and levels of understanding about yourself, as well as how you show up in your marriage. And when you're both able to gain more self-awareness in this way, it helps you grow in your relationship together, too.

Curiosity has the power to transform crucial areas of your marriage from how you handle disagreements to how you relate to each other on a daily basis. With it, you can gain a better understanding of your spouse and yourself. How do you incorporate curiosity into your relationship? Let us know in the comments!

In February, The Link was able to serve 12 families with common household needs with our Household Exchange Program. The Food Pantry served 65 households in February (including: 107 adults, 52 children and 22 seniors) and distributed a total of 3115 pounds of food. Host Families Needed for Foreign Exchange Students...


We need families - anywhere in America (so tell your friends and relatives) - who can host foreign exchange students!

Story Behind The Song...

Easter has been the topic of more hymns than any other, besides Christmas. Over the years we have written about many great traditional Easter hymns. This month, I am going to feature a relatively new song, but one that you have undoubtedly heard if you ever listen to Christian radio... "RATTLE!"

Chris Brown, lead singer of Elevation Worship and one of the songwriters, says RATTLE! was created out of the COVID-19 pandemic. He and his fellow songwriters (Steven Furtick and Brandon Lake) saw how so many people buried and mourned over their loved ones this past year. As people who love and know Jesus, the foundation of faith is built on the trust that comes with Jesus' resurrection. With that hope in mind, RATTLE! was created. They wanted to write authentically about experiencing lockdown, but also give the church something to shout about. "This isn't the end," he said, "I will get to go and see life again and experience life again, and let's believe it."

Brown, Furtick and Lake wrote the song over voice memos that were shared back and forth, and with Zoom calls. "There just became a significant energy around the song really quickly," Brown told Billboard. "It felt like we had all been in quarantine and we're pent-up, on a roller coaster of emotions. It's like, the news is on and we're up and down with good news, bad news, fear and anxiety. So, yes, this song just came out as a release of emotion and a call to arms."

On the surface of this song, it is easy to see how it is a testament to the resurrection of Jesus, but when we dive a little deeper into the lyrics, there's even more depth to the lyrics. This song was also formed out of a story from Ezekiel 37, the valley of dry bones, and 2 Kings 13:14-21, the man thrown on the bones of Elisha. In Ezekiel 37 we read about how Ezekiel was led by the Lord to a valley that was full of dry bones. The Lord then asks Ezekiel if the bones in the valley can live, to which, Ezekiel replies, "Lord, you alone know."

"Then he said to me, 'Prophesy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the Lord! This is what the Sovereign Lord says

to these bones: I will make breath enter you, and you will come to life. I will attach tendons to you and make flesh come upon you and cover you with skin; I will put breath in you, and you will come to life. Then you will know that I am the Lord." Ezekiel 37:4-6 (NIV)

Ezekiel began to prophesy over the bones as the Lord had told him, and as he did, he heard the noise of the bones rattling as they came together. The Lord then asks Ezekiel to prophesy breath into these bones so that they may live. Once more, Ezekiel begins to prophesy and before his very eyes, a vast army comes to life, standing in the valley where there had just been dry bones everywhere. Why did God ask Ezekiel to do this and show him this vision? It was a message to the people of Israel, who felt their hope was gone. They felt dead inside and as dry as the bones in the valley. God's message was simple: "I will put my Spirit in you, and you will live again" (Ezekiel 37:14). This was a message of hope that He was breathing into them.

Released on April 23, 2021 as the third official single from Graves Into Gardens, "Rattle!" became Elevation Worship's second song to top Billboard's Christian Airplay Chart.
