Questions for Pastor...

What does God mean when He says, "I will be with you always"?

Great question! I mentioned in a recent sermon that it's easy to think "Well, that means He'll be there for moral support and a shoulder to cry on." He certainly will be there for those things, but that's not the number one reason God promises His Presence.



There are four passages that come to mind when I think about God's promise of "being there."

"And God said, 'I will be with you." Exodus 3:12

God said this to Moses when Moses made an excuse that he wasn't up to the task after God had commissioned him to lead the Israelites out of Egypt.

"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." Joshua 1:9

(Our discipleship verse for July).

God spoke this to Joshua after choosing him to succeed Moses in leading the people into The Promised Land

"And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:20

Jesus spoke this to His Apostles after commissioning them to "As you go, wherever you go, make disciples of all peoples."

"Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said,

"Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you."

Hebrews 13:5

God speaks this through the writer of the New Testament book of Hebrews as He gives some final instructions to followers of Christ at the end of the book.

You could sum up God's promises to be with people in those passages with this sentence:

"Whatever I've called you to do, you can do it - even if it's difficult because I will be with you with my power. And remember, NOTHING is impossible for me."

The common thread running through each of those passages is that there is some action (or attitude) that God has called people to achieve.

It may be obvious, but from these passages we see that we can't count on God to be with us to help us when we're doing things He does not want or hasn't planned for us to do. That really highlights the importance of seeking His will and following it.

So, remember:

"If God calls you to do something - or go through something - He always promises to be with you to help you do it - or get through it."



You've seen our sign board out by the road with the beginning of a sentence: "Thank God For..." Each week we'd like to change the ending of that sentence to encourage people who drive




past to remember that God is the giver of all good things - especially things we take for granted.

Note: This is the second of six straight months where we use a confirmation verse as our Discipleship Verse. This month's verse is Kiirsten Hansen's confirmation verse.


Independence Day...

We are launching the second phase of our Church Building Campaign to construct a new Sanctuary that will better meet the needs of our Congregation and community. The addition of a sanctuary will facilitate our worship needs and at the same time allow us to turn the current worship space into Sunday School or Bible study rooms and enlarged Fellowship area.

For this phase of our campaign, we are seeking to raise \$250,000 prior to the start of the construction. Currently the mortgage is paid off and there is \$115,000 in savings for the new Sanctuary already. Someone has graciously put out a challenge to the congregation to raise \$70,000 and when that happens, they will donate the remaining \$100.000 to reach our goal of \$250,000.

Someone has really stepped out in faith and the building committee is inviting every member to prayerfully consider how you can be a part of this challenge. Whether through a one-time gift or a monthly pledge, our mission is to raise these funds within the next twelve to fifteen months so please keep that in mind when completing your pledge card

3 Types of Expectations That Will Cause Conflict

Whether we realize it or not, our expectations have a big impact on how we perceive and experience life. Was your day good or bad? Did that new restaurant hit the mark or fall short? Was your long awaited vacation everything you hoped it would be? It all depends on what type of expectations you had. And the same applies to your marriage.



Unmet expectations are the root cause of many marital disagreements, and they can come in several forms. Here are 3 types of expectations that can cause conflict between you and your spouse.

1. Unrealistic

When it comes to marriage, having expectations can be healthy. They help to set a standard for what is or isn't acceptable and provide a baseline for holding yourself and each other accountable. They have the potential to push us to be better partners and to grow as a couple. However, there needs to be a balance between aspirational and attainable. When they are too idealistic, you're bound to be disappointed. For example, if you go into marriage expecting nothing but romance and smooth sailing, with nary a fight between you, chances are you're going to be let down. If you expect your spouse to always know what you need and never do anything that upsets you, they're inevitably going to fall short. Expecting perfection, whether from your spouse or yourself, is simply not realistic—you're both human, after all!

Ingrained

Some of the sneakiest expectations are the ones we don't even realize we have. They've been imprinted upon us through various means, whether it's what we observed and internalized growing up, what society and culture tells us is acceptable, or even our own personal desires and perceptions. If you've ever found yourself getting upset about something, and you're not even sure why, consider whether it's related to an ingrained expectation you're holding. Maybe you think holidays should be celebrated with specific traditions, believe finances will be handled a certain way in your marriage, or have dear ideas about the "correct" order of milestones as a couple. When ingrained expectations are not met, it can spark emotions that seem to come out of nowhere, and

Sometimes we're very much aware of the expectations we have, but we don't actually communicate them to our spouse. Instead, we hope that they'll read our mind or figure out what we want on their own, then feel disappointed or upset when they don't. Maybe your spouse asks what you want to do for your birthday. You give a vague, noncommittal answer. In reality, you know exactly what you want to do, but when your spouse doesn't plan anything, you're annoyed and disappointed. Sure, it's nice when your partner just seems to know exactly what you want without having to spell it out, but realistically, this is unfair to both of you. By clearly communicating expectations, you give your spouse the best chance of meeting them – and yourself the best chance of not feeling let down.

Expectations are like a measuring stick that we hold our reality up against. In the context of marriage, they play a huge role in how happy and satisfied we are. The problem with these three types of expectations is that they essentially rig the game against you, souring your perception of both your spouse and your relationship. The key is to prioritize communication and work together to create expectations that set a healthy standard for how you both want to show up in your marriage.





Story Behind The Song...

In the United States, July 4th is "Independence Day", the annual celebration of nationhood, commemorating the passage of the Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress on July 4, 1776. This hymn, "God of Our Fathers", was written in 1876 for the "Centennial" Fourth of July celebration at Brandon, Vermont. Though it was written to celebrate a United States event, it does not specifically mention the U.S. — so this song is "versatile" and could easily serve in other ways, times and places.

Many American patriotic songs praise the beauty and worth of the United States first, and treat God almost as an afterthought. Not so with this hymn which praises God and prays for His help, while recognizing that we as a nation need God's law and guidance to maintain peace. The language is not modern, but is rich in meaning and heart. It is worth the effort to learn what this song says — making it easier to sing it heartily with understanding.

"God of Our Fathers" communicates a feeling of patriotism and honors the greatness of God. This 19th centruly hymn was written by Daniel Crane Roberts. Roberts was educated at Kenyon College, Gambier, Ohio and when the Civil War started in 1861 he joined the Union Army as a member of the 84th Ohio Volunteer Infantry. Roberts, who in 1876 was serving as rector of St. Thomas & Grace Episcopal churches in Brandon, was asked to write a song for the people to sing during the Centennial celebration. He agreed to do so and the result was "God of Our Fathers."

Roberts was ordained in the Protestant Episcopal Church as a priest in 1866 and ministered to several congregations in Vermont and Massachusetts. In 1878 he began a ministry at St. Paul Church in Concord,

New Hampshire, that lasted for twenty-three years. Serving for many years president of the New Hampshire State Historical Society, Roberts once wrote, "I remain a country parson, known only within my small world," but his hymn "God of Our Fathers" brought him widespread recognition. He received an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Norwich University in 1885.

In 1892, Roberts sent the hymn anonymously to the General Convention of the Episcopal Church to be considered by a group tasked with revising the Episcopal hymnal. If the group accepted his hymn, Roberts said he would send them his name. The commission approved it.

Because of its use in that national celebration, the song became widely known among Americans. As hymnals are being published, most of them include "God of Our Fathers." The three-part fanfare at the beginning of each verse and during each interlude adds greatly to the spirit of the song.

God of our Fathers, Whose Almighty Hand Leads forth in beauty all the starry band. Of Shining worlds in splendor through the skies Our grateful songs, before thy throne arise.

Thy Love divine hath led us in the past. In this free land by thee our lot is cast. Be thou our ruler, guardian, guide, and stay. Thy Word Our Law, thy Paths our chosen ways.

From wars alarms, from deadly pestilence, Be thy Strong arm our ever sure defense; Thy true religion in our hearts increase, Thy Bounteous goodness, nourish us in peace.

Refresh thy people on their toilsome way; Lead us from night, to never ending day; Fill all our lives, with love and grace divine, And glory, laud, and praise be ever thine.

People speak of "God and country", but might not know a lot of details of that relationship through our history. There is a lot of history that connects God with the founding of the United States. Let's take a look at just one of many significant historical events.

Way back on April 29, 1607, long before the Declaration of Independence, a wooden cross was planted and the following famous prayer and decree were made by Robert Hunt at Cape Henry, Virginia.

"We do hereby dedicate this land and ourselves to reach the people within these shores with the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to raise up

godly generations after us, and with these generations, take the Kingdom of God to all the earth. May this covenant of dedication remain to all generations as long as the earth remains, and may this land, along with England, be Evangelist to the world. May all who see this Cross remember what we have done here, and may those, who come here to inhabit, join us in this covenant and in this noblest work that the Holy Scriptures may be fulfilled. From these very shores, the gospel shall go forth, not only to this New World, but the entire world."

After that declaration, this powerful Bible passage was read:

All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations will bow down before him, for dominion belongs to the LORD and he rules over the nations. (Psalm 22:27-28).
