Questions for Pastor...

"How was your Christmas?"

I know I'm not the only one who got asked this question!

Before I get to the answer, I have a little story to share:

On one Christmas break from seminary we were visiting my parents. Violet and I went to the nursing home in town to see some folks I knew when I was growing up.

We hadn't gone to see Mary St. John, but just like the prophetess Anna did when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus into the temple to dedicate Him, Mary "came up to us at that very moment" and we began visiting. Mary was the wife of the mechanic that my dad "turned wrenches with" for some thirty years.

I don't remember exactly what I said, but it must've been something along the lines of "How was your Christmas, Mary? Did you have any special meals or gifts?" But I definitely remember word-for-word Mary's response: Mary stopped smiling and looked me in the eye, "David! You of all people should know Christmas isn't about food. It isn't about presents. It's about Jesus!"

Wow! What a reminder! It's so easy to get caught up in the trappings of Christmas that we miss the point of it all. Oh, we "know" that 'Jesus is the Reason for the Season,' but when someone asks "How was your Christmas?" - and they almost always do - and we mention family or food or gifts or travel and not Jesus, well, we miss a prime opportunity to point people to Jesus!

God tells us in 1 Peter 3:15 "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have..." So, what can you be prepared to say when someone asks "How was your Christmas?"

Here's a suggestion: Tell them of something you did during the Christmas season that reminded you of something about Jesus. (You can also tell them about food, family and gifts.)

For example:

"Family came home and we went to a Candlelight Service. And the pastor showed this hilarious video about a little girl in a Christmas program who took the 'Jesus' doll out of the manger and wouldn't let 'Mary' put it back - even when 'Mary' put her in a headlock. The pastor said we should learn from that little girl and not leave Jesus in the manger, but take Him with us."

Or maybe,

"We went to a Christmas program that the kids put on, and I learned something I didn't know. That holly is a symbol of Jesus. The leaves remind us of the thorny crown and the red berry reminds of the blood he shed on the cross when He grew up."

Or,

"It was good. Family was home. I got a cool gift. We ate oysters - and didn't die. AND we went to a Candlelight service. It's my favorite service of the year." And when they ask "why?" (and some of them will) you can add: "Because it reminds me that Jesus is the Light who shines the way for me in dark times."

Or,

"It was a pretty quiet Christmas. Watched some shows. And I noticed something new when I watched 'Charlie Brown Christmas' for the 10th time: When Linus recited the angel's message: 'Fear not...' he dropped the security blanket that he held tight the rest of the show. It was obviously designed to show that Jesus' coming takes away our fears."

Or even simpler,

"We went to a Candlelight service, and I was reminded _____."
(you fill in the blank.)

Christmas may be the one time of year when people are open to hearing you say something about Jesus. (They know it's about Him too!) So, what reminded you of some truth about Jesus this Christmas?"

At the thought of seeing you."

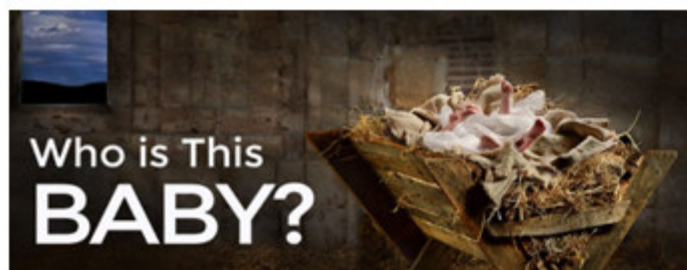

Set Your Marriage Up for Success in the New Year

After a couple weeks of indulging in the treats and trappings of the holidays, getting back to real life when it's all over can be a very rude awakening. 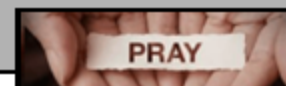

Story Behind The Song...

We are still in the twelve days of Christmas so I would like to talk about that familiar Christmas song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas".

The 12 days celebrate the time between Jesus' birth (Dec 25th) and the arrival of the Three Wise Men (Magi) on Epiphany (Jan 6th). This is a period of feasting and celebration with Epiphany marking the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles.

While the song's origin has been much debated, it may have been used as a type of catechism, a way to teach faith secretly. The religious wars in sixteenth century England made it dangerous to be a Catholic. Many people practiced their faith in secret. As the legend goes, Catholic families courageously developed unique ways to secretly pass the faith onto their children, like "The 12 Days of Christmas." The well-known song was used to teach children about the Catholic Church.

1st Day of Christmas—A partridge in a pear tree.

A partridge is a bird that is known to sacrifice its life for its babies. This bird represents Jesus, who is willing to give his life for us. The pear tree symbolizes the Cross.

2nd Day of Christmas—Two turtle doves

Did you know that turtle doves often mate for life? Because of this, they are seen as symbols of love, fidelity, and connection. In "The

Twelve Days of Christmas," the two turtle doves represent the Old and New Testament, which are deeply connected and meaningful.

3rd Day of Christmas—three French hens

The three French hens signify the three theological virtues: faith, hope, and love (or charity).

4th Day of Christmas—four calling birds

The four calling birds symbolize the four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, which spread the good news of Jesus' life and teachings.

5th Day of Christmas—five golden rings

The five golden rings represent the first five books of the Old Testament, also known as the Pentateuch or the Torah. These books include: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy.

6th Day of Christmas—six geese a-laying

The six geese a-laying symbolize the six days of creation, emphasizing God's power as the creator of the world.

7th Day of Christmas—seven swans a-swimming

The seven swans a-swimming represent the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

8th Day of Christmas—eight maids a-milking

The eight maids a-milking symbolizes the eight Beatitudes preached by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount.

9th Day of Christmas—nine ladies dancing

The nine ladies dancing represents the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

10th Day of Christmas—ten lords a-leaping

The ten lords a-leaping signifies the Ten Commandments, which provide guidance for how to be the best-version-of-yourself.

11th Day of Christmas—eleven pipers piping

The eleven pipers piping represent the eleven faithful disciples of Jesus: Peter, Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the Younger, Simon, and Jude.

12th Day of Christmas—twelve drummers drumming

The twelve drummers drumming represent the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostles' Creed, which summarizes the core beliefs of Christianity.

Whether or not you believe the legend that this song was created as

a type of secret code to teach about Christianity, the explanations of the daily "gifts" are a great reminder of the aspects of our faith. So whenever you hear the "12 Days of Christmas" think of the deeper spiritual meaning of each day of the song.
